Senate Joint Resolution No. 4—Relative to the federal Older Americans Act of 1965.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SJR 4, as amended, Monning. Reauthorization of the federal Older Americans Act of 1965.

This measure would memorialize the President and Congress of the United States to enact appropriate legislation reauthorizing the federal Older Americans Act of 1965.

Fiscal committee: no.

- 1 WHEREAS, In 2006, Congress reauthorized the federal Older
- 2 Americans Act of 1965 in its entirety, effective through the 2011
- 3 fiscal year; and

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1 WHEREAS. The federal Older Americans Act of 1965 has not 2 been reauthorized since 2006, although it was updated in 2009 and 3 funding for its programs has been authorized since that date on an 4 annual basis; and 5 WHEREAS, The Congressional appropriations staff continue to stress the tight spending caps on discretionary programs imposed 6 7 by the Balanced Budget Act of 1997; and 8 WHEREAS, A substantial number of older Americans living 9 in the State of California will be at risk if there are significant reductions in allocated funds for the programs funded by the act; 10 11 and 12 WHEREAS, Further delay in the reauthorization of the federal 13 Older Americans Act of 1965 will erode the capacity of the act's various structures to deliver services to meet the needs of older 14 15 Americans; and WHEREAS, The federal Older Americans Act of 1965 should 16 17 immediately be reauthorized to preserve the aging network's role in home- and community-based services, maintain the advocacy 18 19 and consumer directed focus of the act, and give area agencies on 20 aging increased flexibility in planning and delivering services to 21 vulnerable older Americans; and 22 WHEREAS, The federal Older Americans Act of 1965 should 23 be funded in the same manner in which the act has been funded for the past 48 years; now, therefore, be it 24 25 Resolved by the Senate and the Assembly of the State of California, jointly, That the Legislature memorializes the President 26 27 and the Congress of the United States to enact appropriate 28 legislation that would reauthorize the federal Older Americans Act 29 of 1965. 30 Resolved, That the Secretary of the Senate transmit copies of this resolution to the President and Vice President of the United 31 32 States, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, to the 33 Majority Leader of the Senate, to the Chairman of the Senate 34 Special Committee on Aging, to each Senator and Representative 35 from California in the Congress of the United States, and to the 36 author for appropriate distribution.

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
