SENATE BILL

An act to add Section 4648.11 to the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to developmental services.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 208, as amended, Lara. Developmental services: request for proposals.

Under existing law, the Lanterman Developmental Disabilities Services Act, the State Department of Developmental Services is authorized to contract with regional centers to provide services and supports to individuals with developmental disabilities. The services and supports to be provided to a regional center consumer are contained in an individual program plan (IPP), developed in accordance with prescribed requirements. Existing law authorizes the regional center to, among other things, solicit an individual or agency, by requests for proposals (RFPs) or other means, to provide needed services or supports that are not available to achieve the stated objectives of a consumer's IPP.

This bill would establish the Equity and Diversity in Developmental Services Act, and would require a request for proposals that is prepared by the department or by a regional center and that relates to consumer programs or services and supports to include a section on issues of equity and diversity, as specified.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Legislature hereby finds and declares the

8 (a) The State Department of Developmental Services and the
9 regional center system provide treatment, habilitation, and other
10 services to Californians with developmental disabilities so that
11 they may lead more independent, productive, and integrated lives.

13 (b) California, where diverse communities account for about
14 60 percent of the population, is now a “majority minority” state.

16 (c) The Lanterman Developmental Disabilities Services Act
17 requires that a person who receives services from a regional center
18 must have programs, services, and supports that are “person
19 centered” and that are based on the specific assessment and needs
20 of each consumer.

22 (d) Therefore, services provided to regional center consumers
23 should be provided in a linguistically and culturally competent
24 manner that promotes equity and diversity for all Californians.

25 SEC. 2. Section 4648.11 is added to the Welfare and
26 Institutions Code, to read:

27 4648.11. (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as
28 the Equity and Diversity in Developmental Services Act.

29 (b) A request for proposals that is prepared by the department
30 or by a regional center and that relates to consumer programs or
31 services and supports shall include a section on issues of equity
32 and diversity.

33 (c) The section on equity and diversity shall request, but not be
34 limited to, all of the following:

35 (1) A statement outlining the applicant’s plan to serve diverse
36 populations.

37 (2) Examples of the applicant’s commitment to addressing the
38 needs of diverse populations.

1 (3) Any additional information that the applicant deems relevant
2 to issues of equity and diversity, including hiring bilingual staff,
3 location of the program site, outreach strategies for underserved
4 communities, and training and other materials in various languages
5 and that are provided in a manner that is linguistically and
6 culturally competent.

7 (4) Nothing in this section shall alter contracts entered into on
8 or before January 1, 2014.

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
