Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 123—Relative to the Sheriff’s Deputies Ronald Wayne Ives and Daniel Jess Lobo, Jr. Memorial Highway.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL’S DIGEST

ACR 123, as introduced, Steinorth. Sheriff’s Deputies Ronald Wayne Ives and Daniel Jess Lobo, Jr., Memorial Highway.

This measure would designate a specified portion of State Highway Route 15 in the County of San Bernardino as the Sheriff’s Deputies Ronald Wayne Ives and Daniel Jess Lobo, Jr., Memorial Highway. The measure would also request the Department of Transportation to determine the cost of appropriate signs showing this special designation and, upon receiving donations from nonstate sources covering the cost, to erect those signs.

Fiscal committee: yes.

- 1 WHEREAS, Ronald Wayne Ives was born in Norwalk,
- 2 California, in 1961. He grew up in the Cities of Buena Park and
- 3 Lakewood, and graduated from Chaffey High School in the City
- 4 of Ontario, California; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Ronald Wayne Ives became a deputy sheriff for
- 6 the San Bernardino County Sheriff’s Department on January 2,
- 7 1996, after graduating from the Sheriff’s Training Academy.
- 8 Deputy Sheriff Ives was originally assigned to the West Valley

1 Detention Center before being promoted and assigned to Patrol at  
2 the Rancho Cucamonga Sheriff's Station in 1999; and

3 WHEREAS, In 2002, Deputy Sheriff Ives rode his bicycle from  
4 the City of Rancho Cucamonga to New York City. The ride raised  
5 money for the survivors of public safety personnel who died in  
6 the September 11, 2001, attacks. The Rancho Cucamonga Police  
7 Department honors this act annually during the "Ron Ives Bicycle  
8 Rodeo"; and

9 WHEREAS, On September 1, 2004, Deputy Sheriff Ives was  
10 killed while on patrol in the Rancho Cucamonga area when an  
11 SUV ran a red light and struck his motorcycle at approximately  
12 50 miles per hour; and

13 WHEREAS, Deputy Sheriff Ives was transported to Arrowhead  
14 Regional Medical Center where he succumbed to his injuries  
15 approximately one hour later; and

16 WHEREAS, Deputy Sheriff Ives served with the San  
17 Bernardino County Sheriff's Department for eight years. He was  
18 survived by his wife, Karen, and his son, Blake; and

19 WHEREAS, Daniel Jess Lobo, Jr., was born in Pomona,  
20 California, in 1970. He grew up in the Cities of Pomona and  
21 Montclair, and graduated from Montclair High School; and

22 WHEREAS, Daniel Jess Lobo, Jr., became a deputy sheriff for  
23 the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department on July 4, 1994,  
24 after graduating from the Sheriff's Training Academy. He was  
25 originally assigned to the West Valley Detention Center before  
26 being promoted and assigned to Patrol at the Rancho Cucamonga  
27 Sheriff's Station in 1998; and

28 WHEREAS, On October 11, 2005, Deputy Sheriff Lobo was  
29 killed in a vehicle accident with his motorcycle while responding  
30 to the scene of another crash in the City of Rancho Cucamonga.  
31 Deputy Sheriff Lobo was traveling behind another motor officer  
32 and a squad car when a vehicle pulled out of a parking lot into  
33 their path. All of the responding units had their emergency  
34 equipment activated; and

35 WHEREAS, The other motor officer and the squad car were  
36 able to swerve out of the car's path, but Deputy Sheriff Lobo's  
37 motorcycle struck the rear of the car. He was thrown approximately  
38 50 feet as the result of the impact. He was flown to Arrowhead  
39 Regional Medical Center where he succumbed to his injuries  
40 approximately one hour later; and

1 WHEREAS, Deputy Sheriff Lobo served with the San  
2 Bernardino County Sheriff's Department for 11 years and was  
3 survived by his wife, Jennifer, and his three daughters, Kiley,  
4 Kadie, and Maddison; now, therefore, be it

5 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, the Senate*  
6 *thereof concurring*, That the Legislature hereby designates that  
7 portion of State Highway Route 15 from its junction with State  
8 Highway Route 210 to Sierra Avenue in the County of San  
9 Bernardino, California, as the Sheriff's Deputies Ronald Wayne  
10 Ives and Daniel Jess Lobo, Jr., Memorial Highway; and be it further

11 *Resolved*, That the Department of Transportation is requested  
12 to determine the cost of appropriate signs consistent with the  
13 signing requirements for the state highway system showing this  
14 special designation and, upon receiving donations from nonstate  
15 sources sufficient to cover that cost, to erect those signs; and be it  
16 further

17 *Resolved*, That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly transmit copies  
18 of this resolution to the Director of Transportation and to the author  
19 for appropriate distribution.
