Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 172—Relative to Bone Marrow Donation Awareness Month.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

ACR 172, as amended, Hadley. Bone Marrow Donation Awareness Month.

This measure would designate the month of May 2016 as Bone Marrow Donation Awareness Month.

1 WHEREAS, Since 1987, when the United States Congress
2 authorized the establishment of a national registry of volunteer
3 bone marrow donors, the National Marrow Donor Program
4 (NMDP), now publicly known as Be The Match, has facilitated
5 more than 74,000 marrow and umbilical cord blood transplants;
6 and

7 WHEREAS, Be The Match states that the number of transplants
8 facilitated through the national Be The Match Registry is “only a
9 fraction of the people who can benefit”; and

10 WHEREAS, One of the leading hurdles cited in a report by the
11 Government Accountability Office is locating a suitably matched,
12 unrelated donor, a process that is often difficult, time-consuming,
13 and costly; and

14 WHEREAS, Seventy percent of patients do not have a donor
15 in their family and rely upon the national registry to find a match;
16 and

17 WHEREAS, California ranks number one in the nation for
18 patients searching for a match; and

19 WHEREAS, There is a need to enhance the understanding of
20 the importance of bone marrow donation, and to encourage
21 Californians to participate in bone marrow donation drives; and

22 WHEREAS, The most prevalent problem with respect to bone
23 marrow donation is the need for racially and ethnically diverse
24 donors because of complex tissue types; and

25 WHEREAS, Of the more than 13.5 million potential donors on
26 the United States’ Be The Match Registry, 40 percent are donors
27 from racially and ethnically diverse backgrounds; and

28 WHEREAS, There is a need to engage the public to increase
29 diversity in the registry, with the goal of finding a matching donor
30 for all patients to receive the transplant they need, when they need
31 it; and

32 WHEREAS, Be The Match operates the world’s largest and
33 most diverse registry of potential bone marrow donors; and

34 WHEREAS, The bone marrow registration process is simple;
35 it only takes a few minutes and requires a cheek swab; now,
36 therefore, be it

37 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, the Senate*
38 *thereof concurring, That the Legislature designates the month of*
39 *May 2016 as Bone Marrow Donation Awareness Month; and be*
40 *it further*
