**ASSEMBLY BILL**

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An act to add Section 101.14 to the Streets and Highways Code, relating to highway signs.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 400, as amended, Alejo. Department of Transportation: changeable message signs.

Existing law provides that the Department of Transportation has full possession and control of all state highways. Existing law, the Outdoor Advertising Act, provides for the regulation by the department of advertising displays, as defined, within view of public highways. Existing law also authorizes the department to install and maintain information signs along state highways.

This bill would require the department, by June 30, 2016, to update its internal policies to allow displays of safety, transportation-related, and ~~voting-related~~ *voting-related* messages on changeable message signs, as defined, *subject to approval by the United States Department of Transportation, as provided.*

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 101.14 is added to the Streets and  
2 Highways Code, to read:

3 101.14. (a) Prior to June 30, 2016, *and subject to federal*  
4 *approval as provided in subdivision (d)*, the department shall  
5 update its internal policies to allow displays of the following types  
6 of messages on changeable message signs:

7 (1) Safety messages.

8 (2) Transportation-related messages.

9 (3) Reminders to register to ~~vote~~: *vote, not more than 14 days*  
10 *prior to the deadline to register to vote in a particular statewide*  
11 *general, primary, or special election.*

12 (4) Reminders to vote as elections ~~approach~~: *approach, not*  
13 *more than 14 days prior to a particular statewide general, primary,*  
14 *or special election.*

15 (b) For purposes of this section, “changeable message sign”  
16 means any electronic sign on a roadway with a changeable message  
17 typically used to alert motorists of traffic conditions, unusual  
18 weather conditions, emergencies, or other events.

19 (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter the  
20 requirements of the Emergency Alert ~~System or System~~, the Amber  
21 Plan under Section 8594 of the Government Code, or the ~~Blue~~  
22 ~~Alert System~~ under Section 8594.5 of the Government Code. *The*  
23 *department shall give priority to the display of emergency alerts,*  
24 *Amber Alerts, and Blue Alerts over the messages authorized*  
25 *pursuant to paragraph (3) or (4) of subdivision (a).*

26 (d) *The department shall not display any information on a*  
27 *changeable message sign authorized pursuant to paragraph (3)*  
28 *or (4) of subdivision (a) unless the United States Department of*  
29 *Transportation, or any of its agencies, has expressly approved the*  
30 *display of that information. If the department is advised by the*  
31 *United States Department of Transportation, or any of its agencies,*  
32 *that the display of information otherwise authorized by paragraph*  
33 *(3) or (4) of subdivision (a) will result in the reduction of federal*  
34 *aid highway funds to the state pursuant to Section 131 of Title 23*  
35 *of the United States Code, that display of information shall not be*  
36 *made.*
