An act to amend Section 56133 of, and to add and repeal Section 56133.5 of, the Government Code, relating to local agency formation.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 402, as amended, Dodd. Local agency services: contracts.

The Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 governs the procedures for the formation and change of organization of cities and special districts. Existing law permits a city or district to provide extended services, as defined, outside its jurisdictional boundaries only if it first requests and receives written approval from the local agency formation commission in the affected county. Under existing law, the commission may authorize a city or district to provide new or extended services outside both its jurisdictional boundaries and its sphere of influence under specified circumstances, including when responding to an impending threat to the public health or safety of the residents in the affected territory where specified requirements are met.

This bill would revise the circumstances under which the commission may authorize a city or district to provide new or extended services.

This bill would additionally establish a pilot program, until January 1, 2021, for the Napa and San Bernardino commissions that would permit those commissions to authorize a city or district to provide new or extended services outside both its jurisdictional boundaries and its sphere of influence under specified circumstances.

This bill would make legislative findings and declarations as to the necessity of a special statute for the Napa and San Bernardino commissions.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 56133 of the Government Code is
 2 amended to read:
 3 56133. (a) A city or district may provide new or extended
 4 services by contract or agreement outside its jurisdictional
 5 boundary only if it first requests and receives written approval
 6 from the commission.
 7 (b) The commission may authorize a city or district to provide
 8 new or extended services outside its jurisdictional boundary but
 9 within its sphere of influence in anticipation of a later change of
 10 organization.
 11 (c) If consistent with adopted policy, the commission may
 12 authorize a city or district to provide new or extended services
 13 outside its jurisdictional boundary and outside its sphere of
 14 influence to respond to an existing or impending threat to the health
 15 or safety of the public or the residents of the affected territory, if
 16 both of the following requirements are met:
 17 (1) The entity applying for approval has provided the
 18 commission with documentation of a threat to the health and safety
 19 of the public or the affected residents.
 20 (2) The commission has notified any alternate service provider,
 21 including any water corporation as defined in Section 241 of the
 22 Public Utilities Code, that has filed a map and a statement of its
 23 service capabilities with the commission.
 24 (d) The executive officer, within 30 days of receipt of a request
 25 for approval by a city or district to extend services outside its
 26 jurisdictional boundary, shall determine whether the request is
 27 complete and acceptable for filing or whether the request is

1 incomplete. If a request is determined not to be complete, the
2 executive officer shall immediately transmit that determination to
3 the requester, specifying those parts of the request that are
4 incomplete and the manner in which they can be made complete.
5 When the request is deemed complete, the executive officer shall
6 place the request on the agenda of the next commission meeting
7 for which adequate notice can be given but not more than 90 days
8 from the date that the request is deemed complete, unless the
9 commission has delegated approval of requests made pursuant to
10 this section to the executive officer. The commission or executive
11 officer shall approve, disapprove, or approve with conditions the
12 extended services. If the new or extended services are disapproved
13 or approved with conditions, the applicant may request
14 reconsideration, citing the reasons for reconsideration.

15 (e) This section does not apply to two or more public agencies
16 where the public service to be provided is an alternative to, or
17 substitute for, public services already being provided by an existing
18 public service provider and where the level of service to be
19 provided is consistent with the level of service contemplated by
20 the existing service provider.

21 (f) This section does not apply to the transfer of nonpotable or
22 nontreated water.

23 (g) This section does not apply to the provision of surplus water
24 to agricultural lands and facilities, including, but not limited to,
25 incidental residential structures, for projects that serve conservation
26 purposes or that directly support agricultural industries. However,
27 prior to extending surplus water service to any project that will
28 support or induce development, the city or district shall first request
29 and receive written approval from the commission in the affected
30 county.

31 (h) This section does not apply to an extended service that a
32 city or district was providing on or before January 1, 2001.

33 (i) This section does not apply to a local publicly owned electric
34 utility, as defined by Section 9604 of the Public Utilities Code,
35 providing electric services that do not involve the acquisition,
36 construction, or installation of electric distribution facilities by the
37 local publicly owned electric utility, outside of the utility's
38 jurisdictional boundary.

39 (j) This section applies only to the commission of the county in
40 which the extension of service is proposed.

1 SEC. 2. Section 56133.5 is added to the Government Code, to
2 read:

3 56133.5. (a) A pilot program is hereby established for the
4 Napa and San Bernardino commissions. If consistent with adopted
5 policy, the Napa and San Bernardino commissions may authorize
6 a city or district to provide new or extended services outside its
7 jurisdictional boundary and outside its sphere of influence to
8 support existing or planned uses involving public or private
9 properties, subject to approval at a noticed public hearing in which
10 the commission makes all of the following determinations:

11 (1) The extension of service or services deficiency was identified
12 and evaluated in a review of municipal services prepared pursuant
13 to Section 56430.

14 (2) The extension of service will not result in *either (1) adverse*
15 *impacts on open space or agricultural lands or* ~~have~~ *(2) growth*
16 *inducing impacts.*

17 (3) ~~A later change of organization~~ *sphere of influence change*
18 *involving the subject territory and its affected agency is not feasible*
19 *under this division or desirable based on the adopted policies of*
20 *the commission.*

21 (b) Subdivision (d) of Section 56133 shall apply to any request
22 for new or extended services pursuant to this section.

23 (c) For purposes of this section, “planned use” means any project
24 that is included in an approved specific plan *as of July 1, 2015.*

25 (d) The Napa and San Bernardino commissions shall submit a
26 report *before January 1, 2020*, to the Legislature on their
27 participation in the pilot program, including how many requests
28 for extension of services were received pursuant to this section
29 and the action by the commission to approve, disapprove, or
30 approve with conditions. The report required to be submitted
31 pursuant to this subdivision shall be submitted in compliance with
32 Section 9795 of the Government Code.

33 (e) This section shall remain in effect only until January 1, 2021,
34 and as of that date is repealed.

35 SEC. 3. The Legislature finds and declares that a special law
36 is necessary and that a general law cannot be made applicable
37 within the meaning of Section 16 of Article IV of the California

- 1 Constitution because of the unique circumstances in Napa and San
- 2 Bernardino.

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
