An act to amend Sections 70901 and 72208 of the Education Code, relating to community colleges.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 404, as amended, Chiu. Community colleges: accreditation.

(1) Existing law establishes the California Community Colleges, under the administration of the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges, as one of the segments of public postsecondary education in this state. Existing law imposes numerous duties on the board of governors with respect to these administrative responsibilities, including a requirement to review the accreditation status of community colleges in certain circumstances.

This bill would add to the duties of the board of governors by requiring it to conduct a survey of the community colleges, including consultation with representatives of both faculty and classified personnel, to develop a report to be transmitted to the United States Department of Education and the National Advisory Committee on Institutional Quality and Integrity that reflects a systemwide evaluation of the regional accrediting agency based on the criteria used to determine an accreditor's status.

(2) Existing law requires the accrediting agency for the community colleges to report to the appropriate policy and budget subcommittees of the Legislature upon the issuance of a decision that affects the accreditation status of a community college and, on a biannual basis, to report any accreditation policy changes that affect the accreditation process or status for a community college.

This bill would require the regional accrediting agency for the community colleges to report to the board of governors as soon as practicable after the National Advisory Committee on Institutional Quality and Integrity has notified the regional accrediting agency of the date by which the agency's application for continued recognition is due.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 70901 of the Education Code is amended
2 to read:
3 70901. (a) The Board of Governors of the California
4 Community Colleges shall provide leadership and direction in the
5 continuing development of the California Community Colleges as
6 an integral and effective element in the structure of public higher
7 education in the state. The work of the board of governors shall at
8 all times be directed to maintaining and continuing, to the
9 maximum degree permissible, local authority and control in the
10 administration of the California Community Colleges.
11 (b) Subject to, and in furtherance of, subdivision (a), and in
12 consultation with community college districts and other interested
13 parties as specified in subdivision (e), the board of governors shall
14 provide general supervision over community college districts, and
15 shall, in furtherance of those purposes, perform the following
16 functions:
17 (1) Establish minimum standards as required by law, including,
18 but not limited to, the following:
19 (A) Minimum standards to govern student academic standards
20 relating to graduation requirements and probation, dismissal, and
21 readmission policies.
22 (B) Minimum standards for the employment of academic and
23 administrative staff in community colleges.

1 (C) Minimum standards for the formation of community colleges
2 and districts.

3 (D) Minimum standards for credit and noncredit classes.

4 (E) Minimum standards governing procedures established by
5 governing boards of community college districts to ensure faculty,
6 staff, and students the right to participate effectively in district and
7 college governance, and the opportunity to express their opinions
8 at the campus level and to ensure that these opinions are given
9 every reasonable consideration, and the right of academic senates
10 to assume primary responsibility for making recommendations in
11 the areas of curriculum and academic standards.

12 (2) Evaluate and issue annual reports on the fiscal and
13 educational effectiveness of community college districts according
14 to outcome measures cooperatively developed with those districts,
15 and provide assistance when districts encounter severe management
16 difficulties.

17 (3) Conduct necessary systemwide research on community
18 colleges, and provide appropriate information services, including,
19 but not limited to, definitions for the purpose of uniform reporting,
20 collection, compilation, and analysis of data for effective planning
21 and coordination, and dissemination of information.

22 (4) (A) Provide representation, advocacy, and accountability
23 for the California Community Colleges before state and national
24 legislative and executive agencies.

25 (B) In order to wholly engage in the recognition review process
26 of an accrediting agency pursuant to subdivision (c) of Section
27 72208, conduct a survey of the community colleges, including
28 consultation with representatives of both faculty and classified
29 personnel, to develop a report to be transmitted to the United States
30 Department of Education and the National Advisory Committee
31 on Institutional Quality and Integrity that reflects a systemwide
32 evaluation of the regional accrediting agency based on the criteria
33 used to determine an accreditor's status.

34 (5) Administer state support programs, both operational and
35 capital outlay, and those federally supported programs for which
36 the board of governors has responsibility pursuant to state or federal
37 law. In so doing, the board of governors shall do the following:

38 (A) (i) Annually prepare and adopt a proposed budget for the
39 California Community Colleges. The proposed budget shall, at a
40 minimum, identify the total revenue needs for serving educational

1 needs within the mission, the amount to be expended for the state
2 general apportionment, the amounts requested for various
3 categorical programs established by law, the amounts requested
4 for new programs and budget improvements, and the amount
5 requested for systemwide administration.

6 (ii) The proposed budget for the California Community Colleges
7 shall be submitted to the Department of Finance in accordance
8 with established timelines for development of the annual Budget
9 Bill.

10 (B) To the extent authorized by law, establish the method for
11 determining and allocating the state general apportionment.

12 (C) Establish space and utilization standards for facility planning
13 in order to determine eligibility for state funds for construction
14 purposes.

15 (6) (A) Establish minimum conditions entitling districts to
16 receive state aid for support of community colleges. In so doing,
17 the board of governors shall establish and carry out a periodic
18 review of each community college district to determine whether
19 it has met the minimum conditions prescribed by the board of
20 governors.

21 (B) In determining whether a community college district satisfies
22 the minimum conditions established pursuant to this section, the
23 board of governors shall review the regional accreditation status
24 of the community colleges within that district.

25 (7) Coordinate and encourage interdistrict, regional, and
26 statewide development of community college programs, facilities,
27 and services.

28 (8) Facilitate articulation with other segments of higher
29 education with secondary education.

30 (9) Review and approve comprehensive plans for each
31 community college district. The plans shall be submitted to the
32 board of governors by the governing board of each community
33 college district.

34 (10) Review and approve all educational programs offered by
35 community college districts and all courses that are not offered as
36 part of an educational program approved by the board of governors.

37 (11) Exercise general supervision over the formation of new
38 community college districts and the reorganization of existing
39 community college districts, including the approval or disapproval
40 of plans therefor.

1 (12) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, be solely
2 responsible for establishing, maintaining, revising, and updating,
3 as necessary, the uniform budgeting and accounting structures and
4 procedures for the California Community Colleges.

5 (13) Establish policies regarding interdistrict attendance of
6 students.

7 (14) Advise and assist governing boards of community college
8 districts on the implementation and interpretation of state and
9 federal laws affecting community colleges.

10 (15) Contract for the procurement of goods and services, as
11 necessary.

12 (16) Carry out other functions as expressly provided by law.

13 (c) Subject to, and in furtherance of, subdivision (a), the board
14 of governors shall have full authority to adopt rules and regulations
15 necessary and proper to execute the functions specified in this
16 section as well as other functions that the board of governors is
17 expressly authorized by statute to regulate.

18 (d) Wherever in this section or any other statute a power is
19 vested in the board of governors, the board of governors, by a
20 majority vote, may adopt a rule delegating that power to the
21 chancellor, or any officer, employee, or committee of the California
22 Community Colleges, or community college district, as the board
23 of governors may designate. However, the board of governors
24 shall not delegate any power that is expressly made nondelegable
25 by statute. Any rule delegating ~~authority~~ *power* shall prescribe the
26 limits of delegation.

27 (e) In performing the functions specified in this section, the
28 board of governors shall establish and carry out a process for
29 consultation with institutional representatives of community college
30 districts so as to ensure their participation in the development and
31 review of policy proposals. The consultation process shall also
32 afford community college organizations, as well as interested
33 individuals and parties, an opportunity to review and comment on
34 proposed policy before it is adopted by the board of governors.

35 SEC. 2. Section 72208 of the Education Code is amended to
36 read:

37 72208. (a) The regional accrediting agency for the community
38 colleges shall report to the appropriate policy and budget
39 subcommittees of the Legislature upon the issuance of a decision
40 that affects the accreditation status of a community college and,

1 on a biannual basis, report any accreditation policy changes that
2 affect the accreditation process or status for a community college.

3 (b) The Office of the Chancellor of the California Community
4 Colleges shall ensure that the appropriate policy and budget
5 subcommittees of the Legislature are provided the information
6 required to be reported pursuant to subdivision (a).

7 (c) The regional accrediting agency shall report to the board of
8 governors as soon as practicable after the National Advisory
9 Committee on Institutional Quality and Integrity has notified the
10 regional accrediting agency of the date by which the agency's
11 application for continued recognition is due.
