LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 507, as introduced, Olsen. Department of Consumer Affairs. Existing law provides for the licensure and regulation of various professions and vocations by boards within the Department of Consumer Affairs. Existing law authorizes the Governor to remove from office any member of any board within the department appointed by him or her for, among other things, unprofessional or dishonorable conduct.

This bill would make nonsubstantive changes to these provisions. Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 106 of the Business and Professions Code is amended to read:
