An act to add Section 21080.31 to the Public Resources Code, relating to the environment.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1647, as introduced, Waldron. Environmental quality: water storage facilities.

The California Environmental Quality Act requires a lead agency, as defined, to prepare, or cause to be prepared, and certify the completion of, an environmental impact report on a project that it proposes to carry out or approve that may have a significant effect on the environment or to adopt a negative declaration if it finds that the project will not have that effect. The act also requires a lead agency to prepare a mitigated negative declaration for a project that may have a significant effect on the environment if revisions in the project would avoid or mitigate that effect and there is no substantial evidence that the project, as revised, would have a significant effect on the environment. The act requires the lead agency to determine whether a project may have a significant effect on the environment based on substantial evidence in light of the whole record. The act exempts certain specified projects from its requirements.

This bill would exempt a project to expand the storage capacity of an existing surface water storage facility, or to replace an existing surface water storage facility, that is owned and operated by a public entity if that public entity adopts, by resolution, findings and declarations that the project meets specified criteria. The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 21080.31 is added to the Public Resources 2 Code, to read:
 - 21080.31. (a) This division does not apply to a project to expand the storage capacity of an existing surface water storage facility, or to replace an existing surface water storage facility, that is owned and operated by a public entity if that public entity adopts, by resolution, at a public meeting findings and declarations that the project meets all of the following criteria:
 - (1) The facility supplies water for both agricultural and nonagricultural purposes, reducing the need for imported water.
 - (2) The project either replaces an existing surface water storage facility or expands the water storage capacity of the facility by no more than 25 percent.
 - (3) The project is necessary to preserve the operation of the facility consistent with the historical purposes and the prior use of the facility.
 - (4) The project complies with all applicable federal and state safety guidelines.
 - (5) The project is necessary because the facility may fail during a significant earthquake, causing flood damage.
 - (b) This section does not alter, affect, expand, or diminish the obligation of a public agency to comply with other applicable state or federal laws and regulations.
