LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SCA 11, as introduced, Fuller. Elections: initiative, referendum, and recall.

The California Constitution provides that all political power is inherent in the people and that government is instituted for their protection, security, and benefit. The California Constitution provides that the people have the right to alter or reform government when the public good may require.

This measure would make technical, nonsubstantive changes to this provision.
