Senate Resolution No. 44—Relative to National Health Center Week.

WHEREAS, Community clinics and health centers are at the 1 2 core of the nation's health care safety net, serving anyone and 3 everyone who walks through their doors, regardless of ability to 4 pay, and are the medical homes for more than 23 million needy 5 and uninsured patients; and 6 WHEREAS, According to multiple government, academic, and 7 private studies, community clinics and health centers have proven 8 to be the most cost-effective health care providers in the field, 9 saving nearly \$24 billion annually by keeping patients out of 10 costlier health care settings, such as emergency rooms; and 11 WHEREAS, Community clinics and health centers are private, 12 nonprofit corporations. The majority of their boards of directors, 13 by law, must be their patients and consumers, and their services

are funded primarily through public programs such as Medicaid,
 federal grants, and state initiatives; and

WHEREAS, Community clinics and health centers employ more than 11,300 physicians and 8,400 nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and certified nurse midwives as part of a multidisciplinary clinical team designed to treat the whole patient by coordinating care and managing chronic disease, while at the same time reducing unnecessary, avoidable, and wasteful use of health resources; and

WHEREAS, Community clinics and health centers in California
and throughout the nation have led the movement for a fair and
equitable health care system, treating medically underserved
populations in medically underserved areas by reaching into the

1 inner city and the most rural and geographically isolated 2 communities; and

3 WHEREAS, In California, more than five million low-income

4 families, children, seniors, women, non-English speakers, people

5 of color, and homeless individuals currently receive comprehensive primary care services at nearly 1,000 community clinics and health

7 centers throughout the state; and

8 WHEREAS, Primary care at California community clinics and 9 health centers involves a wide range of services, including 10 preventive care, chronic disease management, well child, dental, pharmaceutical, immunization, mental health, substance abuse, 11 12 breast cancer, nutrition, family planning, and pregnancy-related 13 services, all of which are provided with particular sensitivity to 14 language and cultural competency; and 15 WHEREAS, California's community clinics and health centers

have the major responsibility to provide health care services to the 16 17 state's most disadvantaged families and individuals, are at the 18 forefront in implementing the national Patient Protection and 19 Affordable Care Act, and are serving the over three million 20 Californians newly enrolled in Medi-Cal and Covered California 21 under the act, as well as the two million to three million persons

22 who remain uninsured; and

23 WHEREAS, California's and the nation's community clinics 24 and health centers deserve to be recognized and acknowledged for

25 their valuable services to their communities and the state, their

26 cost-effective delivery of primary health care services to the most

27 vulnerable populations, and their leadership in working for fair

28 and equitable health care reform; and

29 WHEREAS, National Health Center Week offers the opportunity

30 to recognize America's health centers, their dedicated staff and 31 board members, and all those responsible for the continued success

32 and growth of the program since its creation 50 years ago. During

33 National Health Center Week, the legacy of America's health

34 centers and their vital role in shaping the future of America's health

35 care system is celebrated; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate of the State of California, That the Senate 36

37 hereby joins in proclaiming the week of August 9 to August 15,

38 2015, inclusive, as National Health Center Week in California;
