SENATE BILL

An act to amend Section 14115.8 of, to amend, repeal, and add Section 14132.47 of, and to add Sections 14005.272, 14005.273, 14005.274, 14132.471, and 14132.472 to, the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to Medi-Cal.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 123, as amended, Liu. Medi-Cal: school-based administrative activities.

Existing law provides for the Medi-Cal program, which is administered by the State Department of Health Care Services, under which qualified low-income individuals receive health care services. The Medi-Cal program is, in part, governed by, and funded pursuant to, federal Medicaid program provisions. Existing law establishes an administrative claiming process under which the department is

authorized to contract with local governmental agencies and local educational consortia for the purpose of obtaining federal matching funds to assist with the performance of administrative activities relating to the Medi-Cal program. Existing law defines a local educational agency for these purposes as a local educational agency that participates under the process as a subcontractor to the local educational consortium in its service region.

Existing law provides that specified services provided by local educational agencies (LEAs) are covered Medi-Cal benefits and requires the department to perform various activities with respect to the billing option for services provided by LEAs, including amendment of the Medicaid state plan to ensure that schools shall be reimbursed for all eligible services they provide. Existing law requires the department to file an annual report with the Legislature that provides information related to these activities, as specified. Existing law requires the department to regularly consult with the State Department of Education, school district representatives, county offices of education, the local educational consortium, and local educational agencies to assist in formulating those state plan amendments. Existing law funds these activities by requiring the department to proportionately reduce federal Medicaid payments allocable to LEAs, collect the reductions, and deposit them into the Local Educational Agency Medi-Cal Recovery Fund, as specified.

This bill would additionally require the department to contract directly with a LEA, if the LEA chooses and the department has developed a process governing direct contracting, to perform school-based administrative activities necessary for the proper and efficient administration of the Medi-Cal program, as specified. The bill would designate the contracting between the department and participating local educational agencies, local educational consortia, and local governmental agencies to perform those school-based administrative activities as the School-Based Administrative Claiming process program. The bill would authorize the department to administer or oversee the administration of a single statewide random moment time survey, or a reduction in the number of quarterly random moment time surveys conducted in the state, for the purposes of the program. The bill would make related legislative findings and declarations.

This bill would require the department to prepare and post on its Internet Web site an annual report of the costs of administering the School-Based Administrative Claiming process program and the LEA

billing option and list local educational agency participation in each. The bill would also require the department to include in that report the annual report related to the LEA billing option.

This bill would require the department to enter into an interagency agreement or memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the State Department of Education to coordinate the efforts of both departments with respect to the LEA billing option and the School-Based Administrative Claiming process program. The bill would require the department to develop an appeals process, as specified, to contest an action of the department.

This bill would require the department and the State Department of Education to establish and jointly administer and chair a School-Based Health Program and Policy Workgroup, as specified, in order to assist the department in formulating state plan amendments required to implement the LEA billing option described above and for the purpose of advising the department on issues related to the delivery of school-based Medi-Cal services to students in the state, as specified. The bill would require the department to consult with the advisory group in connection with developing the interagency agreement or MOU described above. The bill would authorize the department and the State Department of Education to use moneys collected by the department to fund the LEA Medi-Cal billing option program activities and amounts withheld from LEAs by agreement with the department to meet the requirements of the interagency agreement or MOU described above and to fund staffing requirements for the workgroup.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) The Legislature finds and declares all of the
- 2 following:
- 3 (1) Effective cross-agency collaboration is vital to deliver
- 4 high-quality school-based health services to California students.
- 5 (2) The United States Department of Education and the United
- 6 States Department of Health and Human Services, in a key January
- 7 2016 policy letter, recognize the critical role that health care
- 8 coverage and health services play in ensuring all students are ready
- 9 and able to learn, and recommend action steps to better coordinate
- 10 health and education services to build strong and sustainable

1 partnerships and commitments between health and education
2 agencies at the local, state, and federal levels.

3 (3) The student success strategic priority in State Superintendent
4 of Public Instruction Tom Torlakson's 2015 Blueprint 2.0 includes
5 Section 3.13, which prioritizes the development of infrastructure
6 at the State Department of Education to improve cross-agency
7 collaboration in support of student health.

8 (4) In Report 2014-130 issued on August 20, 2015, the State
9 Auditor recommended that the State Department of Health Care
10 Services institute significant structural changes to school-based
11 Medi-Cal programs in order to improve administration and
12 oversight, increase federal funding, and cut costs.

13 (5) Building an effective, transparent infrastructure and
14 accountability system to fully utilize all available federal Medicaid
15 funds is a critical component of developing the capacity to deliver
16 school-based health and mental health programs.

17 (6) These vital programs must be operated at a level that meets
18 the benchmark of national best practices in order to meet the needs
19 of California's most vulnerable children.

20 (b) It is the intent of the Legislature to ensure effective
21 coordination between health and education agencies at the state,
22 county, and local levels to address the achievement gap in our
23 schools and health and education equity issues in California.

24 SEC. 2. Section 14005.272 is added to the Welfare and
25 Institutions Code, to read:

26 14005.272. (a) The department and the State Department of
27 Education shall, no later than July 1, 2017, establish and jointly
28 administer and chair a School-Based Health Program and Policy
29 Workgroup for the purpose of advising on issues related to the
30 delivery of school-based Medi-Cal services to students in the state.
31 The workgroup shall develop recommendations for an interagency
32 agreement between the department and the State Department of
33 Education pursuant to Section 14132.472, and assist the department
34 in formulating the state plan amendments required by subdivisions
35 (a) and (b) of Section 14115.8. The scope of the workgroup shall
36 include, but not be limited to, improving the operation of and
37 participation in the following school-based health programs:

38 (1) The School-Based Administrative Claiming process program
39 described in Section 14132.471.

1 (2) The local educational agency (LEA) Medi-Cal billing option
2 described in Section 14132.06.

3 (b) The workgroup shall be representative of the diversity of
4 California LEAs with respect to size, type, and geographic diversity
5 and shall include representatives from county offices of education,
6 urban, suburban, and rural LEAs, and LECs and LGAs described
7 in Section 14132.471 and from Region IX of the federal Centers
8 for Medicare and Medicaid Services. The workgroup shall also
9 include the LEA Ad Hoc Workgroup described in Section 14132.06
10 and members with expertise in the school-based health and mental
11 health programs.

12 (c) The workgroup shall, no later than January 1, 2018, provide
13 input to the department and the State Department of Education on
14 the development and continuing operations of the interagency
15 agreement or memorandum of understanding described in Section
16 14132.472. The recommendations of the workgroup shall identify
17 opportunities for effective coordination between the state's health
18 and education systems at the state, regional, and local level, identify
19 ways the department can maximize its school-based Medicaid
20 program expertise, recommend an appeals process for the
21 School-Based Administrative Claiming process program and the
22 LEA billing option, and identify necessary legislation or state plan
23 amendments to support its recommendations.

24 (d) (1) The workgroup shall, on a regular basis, provide input
25 to the department and the State Department of Education on the
26 degree to which the process and implementation of the
27 School-Based Administrative Claiming process program described
28 in Section 14132.471 and the LEA Medi-Cal billing option program
29 described in Section 14132.06 are meeting the needs of LEAs with
30 respect to cost-effectiveness, program structure, and operational
31 effectiveness, including the process of appeals and balancing
32 withheld funds and actual expenses.

33 (2) The workgroup shall advise the department and the State
34 Department of Education on creating consistency across local
35 educational consortia (LECs), local governmental agencies (LGAs),
36 and the department with respect to contracts and processes for the
37 School-Based Administrative Claiming process program described
38 in Section 14132.471.

(3) The workgroup shall make recommendations that include, but are not limited to, determining the opportunities for and the benefits, costs, and feasibility of the following:

(A) Increasing LEA participation and maximizing allowable federal financial participation in the School-Based Administrative Claiming process program and the LEA Medi-Cal billing option program.

(B) Increasing contracting options for LEAs participating in the School-Based Administrative Claiming process program, such as allowing an LEA to contract with an LEC or LGA outside of the LEA's region.

(C) Reducing the number of quarterly random moment time surveys.

(D) Identifying areas that may require a state plan amendment.

(E) Integrating and expanding other school-based health and mental health programs with the School-Based Administrative Claiming process program and the LEA Medi-Cal billing option program, ~~including~~ *including, but not limited to*, those being implemented in accordance with the LEA's local control and accountability plan described in Section 52060 of the Education Code.

(F) Improving and streamlining the annual school-based Medi-Cal report described in Section 14005.273.

(e) The workgroup may form technical advisory subcommittees as necessary that shall report back to the workgroup on the development of plans and timelines to implement the changes and expanded options described in this section.

(f) The department shall make available to the workgroup staff any information on other school-based dental, health, and mental health programs, including, but not limited to, the mental health programs described in Section 14700 and school-based health centers that may receive Medi-Cal funding.

SEC. 3. Section 14005.273 is added to the Welfare and Institutions Code, to read:

14005.273. Commencing with the 2017–18 state fiscal year, and annually for each year thereafter, the department shall publish the following information in a single annual school-based Medi-Cal report on a section of its Internet Web site:

(a) The costs to the state of operating the School-Based Administrative Claiming process program described in Section

1 14132.471 and any related fees passed on to local educational
2 agencies (LEAs).

3 (b) A list of all participating LEAs.

4 (c) The costs and fees being charged to LEAs as reported to the
5 department by local educational consortia and local governmental
6 agencies.

7 (d) Comparisons of costs with other states, summary of
8 department activities, workgroup recommendations for program
9 improvement, identifications of barriers to reimbursement and
10 actions taken to eliminate barriers, and other information in the
11 format required for the LEA Medi-Cal billing option program
12 report described in Section 14115.8.

13 (e) The costs of operating the LEA Medi-Cal billing option
14 program described in Section 14132.06. The report shall also list
15 each local educational agency participating in the LEA Medi-Cal
16 billing option program.

17 SEC. 4. Section 14005.274 is added to the Welfare and
18 Institutions Code, to read:

19 14005.274. (a) The department shall develop a process by
20 which a local educational agency may appeal an action of the
21 department with respect to the School-Based Administrative
22 Claiming process program described in Section 14132.471 and
23 the LEA billing option described in Section 14115.8. The appeals
24 process shall use ~~of~~ the Office of Administrative Hearings *and*
25 *Appeals pursuant to Section 14171* or another neutral third party
26 acceptable to the department as the appeals authority and shall
27 require the local educational agency to pay for the cost of the
28 appeal.

29 (b) In developing the appeals process described in subdivision
30 (a), the department shall take into account the recommendations
31 of the workgroup described in Section 14005.272.

32 SEC. 5. Section 14115.8 of the Welfare and Institutions Code
33 is amended to read:

34 14115.8. (a) (1) The department shall amend the Medicaid
35 state plan with respect to the billing option for services by local
36 educational agencies (LEAs), to ensure that schools shall be
37 reimbursed for all eligible services that they provide that are not
38 precluded by federal requirements.

(2) The department shall examine methodologies for increasing school participation in the Medi-Cal billing option for LEAs so that schools can meet the health care needs of their students.

(3) The department, to the extent possible, shall simplify claiming processes for LEA billing.

(4) The department shall eliminate and modify state plan and regulatory requirements that exceed federal requirements when they are unnecessary.

(b) If a rate study for the LEA Medi-Cal billing option is completed pursuant to Section 52 of Chapter 171 of the Statutes of 2001, the department, in consultation with the entities named in subdivision (d) of Section 14005.272, shall implement the recommendations from the study, to the extent feasible and appropriate.

(c) Notwithstanding any other law, or any other contrary state requirement, the department shall take whatever action is necessary to ensure that, to the extent there is capacity in its certified match, an LEA shall be reimbursed retroactively for the maximum period allowed by the federal government for any department change that results in an increase in reimbursement to local educational agency providers.

(d) The department may undertake all necessary activities to recoup matching funds from the federal government for reimbursable services that have already been provided in the state's public schools. The department shall prepare and take whatever action is necessary to implement all regulations, policies, state plan amendments, and other requirements necessary to achieve this purpose.

(e) The department shall file an annual report with the Legislature that shall be included in the annual report referenced in Section 14005.273 and that shall include at least all of the following:

(1) A copy of the annual comparison required by subdivision (h).

(2) A state-by-state comparison of school-based Medicaid total and per eligible child claims and federal revenues. The comparison shall include a review of the most recent two years for which completed data is available.

(3) A summary of department activities and an explanation of how each activity contributed toward narrowing the gap between

1 California's per eligible student federal fund recovery and the per
2 student recovery of the top three states.

3 (4) A listing of all school-based services, activities, and
4 providers approved for reimbursement by the federal Centers for
5 Medicare and Medicaid Services in other state plans that are not
6 yet approved for reimbursement in California's state plan and the
7 service unit rates approved for reimbursement.

8 (5) The official recommendations made to the department by
9 the entities named in subdivision (c) and the action taken by the
10 department regarding each recommendation.

11 (6) A one-year timetable for state plan amendments and other
12 actions necessary to obtain reimbursement for those items listed
13 in paragraph (4).

14 (7) Identification of any barriers to local educational agency
15 reimbursement, including those specified by the entities named in
16 subdivision (d) of Section 14005.272, that are not imposed by
17 federal requirements, and a description of the actions that have
18 been, and will be, taken to eliminate them.

19 (f) (1) These activities shall be funded and staffed by
20 proportionately reducing federal Medicaid payments allocable to
21 LEAs for the provision of benefits funded by the federal Medicaid
22 program under the billing option for services by LEAs specified
23 in this section. Moneys collected as a result of the reduction in
24 federal Medicaid payments allocable to LEAs shall be deposited
25 into the Local Educational Agency Medi-Cal Recovery Fund,
26 which is hereby established in the Special Deposit Fund established
27 pursuant to Section 16370 of the Government Code. These funds
28 shall be used, upon appropriation by the Legislature, only to
29 support the department to meet all the requirements of this section.
30 If at any time this section is repealed, it is the intent of the
31 Legislature that all funds in the Local Educational Agency
32 Medi-Cal Recovery Fund be returned proportionally to all LEAs
33 whose federal Medicaid funds were used to create this fund. The
34 annual amount funded pursuant to this paragraph shall not exceed
35 one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000).

36 (2) Moneys collected under paragraph (1) shall be
37 proportionately reduced from federal Medicaid payments to all
38 participating LEAs so that no one LEA loses a disproportionate
39 share of its federal Medicaid payments.

(3) Moneys collected under paragraph (1) and withheld amounts agreed to by LEAs as a part of an LEA Medi-Cal billing option program provider participation agreement administered by the department may be used by the department and the State Department of Education to meet the requirements of the interagency agreement or memorandum of understanding referenced in Section 14132.472 and the staffing needed to jointly administer and chair the workgroup described in Section 14005.272.

(g) (1) The department may enter into a sole source contract to comply with the requirements of this section.

(2) The level of additional staff to comply with the requirements of this section, including, but not limited to, staff for which the department has contracted for pursuant to paragraph (1), shall be limited to that level that can be funded with revenues derived pursuant to subdivision (f).

(h) The activities of the department shall include all of the following:

(1) An annual comparison of the school-based Medicaid systems in comparable states.

(2) Efforts to improve communications with the federal government, the State Department of Education, and local educational agencies.

(3) The development and updating of written guidelines to local educational agencies regarding best practices to avoid audit exceptions, as needed.

(4) The establishment and maintenance of a local educational agency user-friendly, interactive Internet Web site.

(5) Collaboration with the State Department of Education to help ensure LEA compliance with state and federal Medicaid requirements and to help improve LEA participation in the Medi-Cal billing option for LEAs.

SEC. 6. Section 14132.47 of the Welfare and Institutions Code is amended to read:

14132.47. (a) It is the intent of the Legislature to provide local governmental agencies the choice of participating in either or both of the Targeted Case Management (TCM) and Administrative Claiming process programs at their option, subject to the requirements of this section and Section 14132.44.

1 (b) The department may contract with each participating local
2 governmental agency or each local educational consortium to assist
3 with the performance of administrative activities necessary for the
4 proper and efficient administration of the Medi-Cal program,
5 pursuant to Section 1903a of the federal Social Security Act (42
6 U.S.C. Sec. 1396b(a)), and this activity shall be known as the
7 Administrative Claiming process.

8 (c) (1) Subject to the requirements of paragraph (2) of
9 subdivision (f), as a condition for participation in the
10 Administrative Claiming process, each participating local
11 governmental agency or each local educational consortium shall,
12 for the purpose of claiming federal Medicaid reimbursement, enter
13 into a contract with the department and shall certify to the
14 department the total amount the local governmental agency or each
15 local educational consortium expended on the allowable
16 administrative activities.

17 (2) The department shall deny the claim if it determines that the
18 certification is not adequately supported, or does not otherwise
19 comply with federal requirements, for purposes of claiming federal
20 financial participation.

21 (d) Each participating local governmental agency or local
22 educational consortium may subcontract with private or public
23 entities to assist with the performance of administrative activities
24 necessary for the proper and efficient administration of the
25 Medi-Cal program under the conditions specified by the department
26 in regulations.

27 (e) Each Administrative Claiming process contract shall include
28 a requirement that each participating local governmental agency
29 or each local educational consortium submit a claiming plan in a
30 manner that shall be prescribed by the department in regulations,
31 developed in consultation with local governmental agencies.

32 (f) (1) The department shall require that each participating local
33 governmental agency or each local educational consortium certify
34 to the department both of the following:

35 (A) The expenditure of 100 percent of the cost of performing
36 Administrative Claiming process activities. The funds expended
37 for this purpose shall be from the local governmental agency's
38 general fund or the general funds of local educational agencies or
39 from any other funds allowed under federal law and regulations.

1 (B) In each fiscal year that its expenditures represent costs that
2 are eligible for federal financial participation for that fiscal year.
3 The department shall deny the claim if it determines that the
4 certification is not adequately supported for purposes of federal
5 financial participation.

6 (2) (A) (i) A city that is not a participating local governmental
7 agency, or any other local public entity, that contracts with a local
8 governmental agency pursuant to subdivision (d) and that is located
9 within a county that is a participating local governmental agency
10 pursuant to this section, may submit certification to the local
11 governmental agency of amounts expended for Administrative
12 Claiming services in accordance with Section 433.51 of Title 42
13 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

14 (ii) A city or other local public entity that submits certification
15 pursuant to this paragraph shall comply with the requirements of
16 paragraph (1), with other requirements applicable to local
17 governmental agencies that the department determines, in
18 regulations, to be applicable, and with all applicable federal
19 requirements.

20 (iii) The local governmental agency shall forward the city's or
21 local public entity's certification to the department for the purposes
22 of claiming federal financial participation.

23 (iv) As applicable, the local governmental agency shall obtain
24 and retain appropriate certifications from the expending city or
25 local public entity, together with documentation of the underlying
26 expenditures, as required by the department.

27 (B) A tribe or tribal organization, as defined in subdivision (n),
28 that is not participating in Administrative Claiming process
29 activities as a local governmental agency, may contract with, and
30 submit to a tribe or tribal organization that is contracting with, the
31 department pursuant to subdivision (b) amounts expended for
32 Administrative Claiming process activities that it is certifying in
33 accordance with Section 433.51 of Title 42 of the Code of Federal
34 Regulations and other applicable federal law and regulations. The
35 tribe or tribal organization receiving the certification shall forward
36 it to the department for purposes of claiming federal financial
37 participation. The certification shall comply with all of the
38 requirements for certification set forth in subparagraph (A).

39 (g) (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the
40 state shall be held harmless, in accordance with paragraphs (2)

1 and (3), from any federal audit disallowance and interest resulting
2 from payments made to a participating local governmental agency
3 or local educational consortium pursuant to this section, for the
4 disallowed claim.

5 (2) To the extent that a federal audit disallowance and interest
6 results from a claim or claims for which any participating local
7 governmental agency or local educational consortium has received
8 reimbursement for Administrative Claiming process activities, the
9 department shall recoup from the local governmental agency or
10 local educational consortium that submitted the disallowed claim,
11 through offsets or by a direct billing, amounts equal to the amount
12 of the disallowance and interest, in that fiscal year, for the
13 disallowed claim. All subsequent claims submitted to the
14 department applicable to any previously disallowed administrative
15 activity or claim, may be held in abeyance, with no payment made,
16 until the federal disallowance issue is resolved.

17 (3) Notwithstanding paragraph (2), to the extent that a federal
18 audit disallowance and interest results from a claim or claims for
19 which the participating local governmental agency or local
20 educational consortium has received reimbursement for
21 Administrative Claiming process activities performed by an entity
22 under contract with, and on behalf of, the participating local
23 governmental agency or local educational consortium, the
24 department shall be held harmless by that particular participating
25 local governmental agency or local educational consortium for
26 100 percent of the amount of the federal audit disallowance and
27 interest, for the disallowed claim.

28 (h) The use of local funds required by this section shall not
29 create, lead to, or expand the health care funding obligations or
30 service obligations for current or future years for any participating
31 local governmental agency or local educational consortium, except
32 as required by this section or as may be required by federal law.

33 (i) The department shall deny any claim from a participating
34 local governmental agency or local educational consortium if the
35 department determines that the claim is not adequately supported
36 in accordance with criteria established pursuant to this subdivision
37 and implementing regulations before it forwards the claim for
38 reimbursement to the federal Medicaid program. In consultation
39 with local governmental agencies and local educational consortia,
40 the department shall adopt regulations that prescribe the

1 requirements for the submission and payment of claims for
2 administrative activities performed by each participating local
3 governmental agency and local educational consortium.

4 (j) Administrative activities shall be those determined by the
5 department to be necessary for the proper and efficient
6 administration of the state's Medicaid plan and shall be defined
7 in regulation.

8 (k) If the department denies any claim submitted under this
9 section, the affected participating local governmental agency or
10 local educational consortium may, within 30 days after receipt of
11 written notice of the denial, request that the department reconsider
12 its action. The participating local governmental agency or local
13 educational consortium may request a meeting with the director
14 or his or her designee within 30 days to present its concerns to the
15 department after the request is filed. If the director or his or her
16 designee cannot meet, the department shall respond in writing
17 indicating the specific reasons for which the claim is out of
18 compliance to the participating local governmental agency or local
19 educational consortium in response to its appeal. Thereafter, the
20 decision of the director shall be final.

21 (l) To the extent consistent with federal law and regulations,
22 participating local governmental agencies or local educational
23 consortium may claim the actual costs of nonemergency,
24 nonmedical transportation of Medi-Cal eligibles to Medi-Cal
25 covered services, under guidelines established by the department,
26 to the extent that these costs are actually borne by the participating
27 local governmental agency or local educational consortium. A
28 local educational consortium may only claim for nonemergency,
29 nonmedical transportation of Medi-Cal eligibles for Medi-Cal
30 covered services, through the Medi-Cal administrative activities
31 program. Medi-Cal medical transportation services shall be claimed
32 under the local educational agency Medi-Cal billing option,
33 pursuant to Section 14132.06.

34 (m) As a condition of participation in the Administrative
35 Claiming process and in recognition of revenue generated to each
36 participating local governmental agency and each local educational
37 consortium in the Administrative Claiming process, each
38 participating local governmental agency and each local educational
39 consortium shall pay an annual participation fee through a
40 mechanism agreed to by the state and local governmental agencies

1 and local educational consortia, or, if no agreement is reached by
2 August 1 of each year, directly to the state. The participation fee
3 shall be used to cover the cost of administering the Administrative
4 Claiming process, including, but not limited to, claims processing,
5 technical assistance, and monitoring. The department shall
6 determine and report staffing requirements upon which projected
7 costs will be based. The amount of the participation fee shall be
8 based upon the anticipated salaries, benefits, and operating
9 expenses, to administer the Administrative Claiming process and
10 other costs related to that process.

11 (n) (1) For the purposes of this section, “participating local
12 governmental agency” means a county, chartered city, Native
13 American Indian tribe, tribal organization, or subgroup of a Native
14 American Indian tribe or tribal organization, under contract with
15 the department pursuant to subdivision (b).

16 (2) Each participating Native American Indian tribe, tribal
17 organization, or subgroup of a Native American Indian tribe or
18 tribal organization may claim, as a Medi-Cal Administrative
19 Activity, facilitating Medi-Cal applications, which includes, but

16 (1) Consult with relevant nonprofit organizations involved in
17 facilitating information sharing among state Medicaid and
18 education agencies involved in the administration of Medicaid
19 claiming for school-based services to identify, and implement if
20 feasible, best practices that accomplish the coordination of efforts
21 required by subdivision (a).

22 (2) Consult with the workgroup established pursuant to Section
23 14005.272 regarding the role of the State Department of Education
24 on the impact of the implementation of the School-Based
25 Administrative Claiming process program and the LEA billing
26 option on operations at the local level and any changes to the MOU
27 that the workgroup recommends.

28 (3) Develop a schedule for the regular ongoing meetings of the
29 workgroup established pursuant to Section 14005.272 to provide
30 feedback to the department and the State Department of Education.

31 (4) Ensure that the MOU components developed in collaboration
32 of the State Department of Education and with the input of the
33 workgroup established pursuant to Section 14005.272 are
34 severable.
