ASSEMBLY BILL

Introduced by Assembly Member Speier

January 11, 1995

An act to add and repeal Section 7550.5 of the Government Code, relating to legislative oversight, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 116, as amended, Speier. Legislative oversight: reports.

Existing law requires or requests state and local agencies to prepare and submit reports to the Governor or the Legislature, or both.

This bill would provide that no state or local agency would be required to prepare and submit any written report to the Legislature or the Governor until January 1, 1997, ~~except under specified conditions. A list of specified reports would still be required.~~ *unless it is among a list of specified reports or certain circumstances exist.* The act would be repealed on January 1, 1997.

The bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 7550.5 is added to the
2 Government Code, to read:
3 7550.5. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of
4 law, until January 1, 1997, no state or local agency shall be
5 required to prepare or to submit any written report to the
6 Legislature or the Governor unless *the report is specified*
7 *in subdivision (b) or* any of the following circumstances
8 exist:
9 (1) The report is required either in whole or part by
10 a court, federal law, or regulation.
11 (2) The report is required in the Budget Act.
12 (3) The Legislature expressly provides that,
13 notwithstanding this section, a written report shall be
14 prepared and submitted.

8 This section shall remain in effect only until January 1,
9 1997, and as of that date is repealed, unless a later enacted
10 statute, which is enacted before January 1, 1997, deletes
11 or extends that date.

12 SEC. 2. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the
13 immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or
14 safety within the meaning of Article IV of the
15 Constitution and shall go into immediate effect. The facts
16 constituting the necessity are:

17 A drastic reduction in state resources needed to
18 prepare and submit reports to the Legislature requires
19 this act to take effect immediately.
