An act to add Section 6108 to the Public Contract Code, relating to public contracts.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 734, as introduced, Conroy. Public contracts: out-of-state contractors.

Existing law requires a state agency to give a California company, as defined, a preference on construction contracts as against a nonresident contractor. The preference would be equal to any preference that the nonresident contractor receives on public entity construction contracts in the other state.

This bill would require an out-of-state contractor that bids on a public entity contract to disclose any and all subsidies, present and future rebates, tax subsidies, or any special consideration from the state in which the contractor is based. This bill would require the amount of the rebates, subsidies, and special consideration from the state in which the contractor is based be added to any contract bid submitted to a public entity.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6108 is added to the Public
2 Contract Code, to read:
3 6108. If an out-of-state contractor that is based in a
4 state other than California bids on a contract of a public
5 entity, as defined by Section 1100, the contractor shall
6 disclose any and all subsidies, present and future rebates,
7 tax subsidies, or any special consideration from the state
8 in which the contractor is based. The amount of any
9 rebates, subsidies, and special consideration from the
10 state in which the contractor is based shall be added to
11 any contract bid submitted to a public entity.
