

ASSEMBLY BILL

Introduced by Assembly Member Morrissey

February 23, 1995

An act relating to the California Conservation Corps, making an appropriation therefor, to take effect immediately, usual current expenses.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1145, as introduced, Morrissey. California Conservation Corps.

Existing law, the Budget Act of 1994, provides in a specified item for the appropriation of money to the California Conservation Corps.

This bill would appropriate \$2,709,000 to the California Conservation Corps, for expenditure in the 1994–95 fiscal year in augmentation of Item 3340-001-001 of Section 2.00 of the Budget Act of 1994, for the purpose of fulfilling an obligation pursuant to a settlement agreement entered into by the State of California based on a cause of action alleging violations of the Fair Labor Standards Act.

This bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as a statute providing an appropriation for the usual current expenses of the state.

Vote: $\frac{2}{3}$. Appropriation: yes. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sum of two million seven hundred
2 nine thousand dollars (\$2,709,000) is hereby appropriated
3 from the General Fund to the California Conservation
4 Corps, for expenditure in the 1994–95 fiscal year, in
5 augmentation of Item 3340-001-001 of Section 2.00 of the
6 Budget Act of 1994, for the purposes of fulfilling an
7 obligation pursuant to a settlement agreement entered
8 into by the State of California based on a cause of action
9 alleging violations of the Fair Labor Standards Act.

10 Section 1 of this act makes an appropriation for the
11 usual current expenses of the state within the meaning of
12 paragraph (3) of subdivision (c) of Section 8 of Article IV
13 of the Constitution and shall go into immediate effect.
