An act to ~~amend Section 6254 of~~ *add Section 6254.15* to the Government Code, relating to public records.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1158, as amended, Kuykendall. Public records.

Under existing law, the California Public Records Act, public records are open to inspection during the office hours of state and local agencies with specified exceptions.

This bill would add an exception for certain records relating to the retention, location, relocation, or expansion of a company within California.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: no. State-mandated local program: no.



The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

3 SECTION 1. Section 6254.15 is added to the
4 Government Code, to read:

5 6254.15. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to
6 require the disclosure of records that are any of the
7 following: corporate financial records, corporate
8 proprietary information including trade secrets, and
9 information relating to siting within the state furnished to
10 a government agency by a private company for the
11 purpose of permitting the agency to work with the
12 company in retaining, locating, or expanding a facility
13 within California. Except as provided below, incentives
14 offered by state or local government agencies, if any, shall
15 be disclosed upon communication to the agency or the
16 public of a decision to stay, locate, relocate, or expand, by
17 a company, or upon application by that company to a
18 governmental agency for a general plan amendment,
19 rezone, use permit, building permit, or any other permit,
20 whichever occurs first.

21 The agency shall delete, prior to disclosure to the
22 public, information that is exempt pursuant to this section
23 from any record describing state or local incentives
24 offered by an agency to a private business to retain,
25 locate, relocate, or expand the business within California.
