ASSEMBLY BILL

No. 2352

Introduced by Assembly Member Speier

An act to amend Sections 12517.4, 12520, 12527, 12804.6, 12814.5, 12816, 14900, 14900.1, 14901, 15250.5, 15250.6, 15255, and 15255.1 of, to add Sections 15250.7 and 15255.2 to, and to repeal Section 14901.1 of, the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2352, as amended, Speier. Vehicles: driver's licenses: expiration: fees.

(1) Under existing law, certificates to operate various specified motor vehicles are valid for a maximum of 4 years and expire on the same date as the applicant's driver's license.

This bill would increase the period of validity of these certificates to a maximum of 5 years.

(2) Under existing law, every original driver's license and every renewed driver's license expires on the 4th birthday of the applicant following the date of the application for the license or renewal, except as specified.

This bill would provide for the expiration of a driver's license on the 5th birthday, rather than the 4th birthday, of the

applicant following the date of the application for the license or renewal.

(3) Existing law prohibits the Department of Motor Vehicles from renewing a driver’s license by mail, under a program allowing for renewal by mail, if the license has been previously renewed by mail 2 consecutive times for 4-year periods.

This bill would prohibit that renewal if the license has been previously renewed by mail 2 consecutive times for 5-year periods, rather than 4-year periods, and would make a related, conforming change.

(4) Existing law prescribes various fees, depending upon the type or class of driver’s license, that are required to be paid to the department upon the issuance of an original, renewal, or duplicate licenses.

This bill would increase those fees and would specify that the licenses expire on the 4th or 5th birthday of the applicant, depending upon the license, following the date of the application. The bill would also make technical changes in these provisions.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 12517.4 of the Vehicle Code is
2 amended to read:
3 12517.4. This section governs the issuance of a
4 certificate to drive a schoolbus, school pupil activity bus,
5 youth bus, general public paratransit vehicle, or farm
6 labor vehicle.
7 (a) The driver certificate shall be issued only to
8 applicants meeting all applicable provisions of this code
9 and passing the examinations prescribed by the
10 department and the Department of the California
11 Highway Patrol. The examinations shall be conducted by
12 the Department of the California Highway Patrol,
13 pursuant to Sections 12517, 12519, 12522, 12523, and
14 12523.5.



1 (b) A temporary driver certificate shall be issued by
2 the Department of the California Highway Patrol after an
3 applicant has cleared a criminal history background
4 check by the Department of Justice and, if applicable, the
5 Federal Bureau of Investigation, and has passed the
6 examinations and meets all other applicable provisions of
7 this code.

8 (c) A permanent driver's certificate shall be issued by
9 the department after an applicant has passed all tests and
10 met all applicable provisions of this code. Certificates are
11 valid for a maximum of five years and shall expire on the
12 same date as the applicant's driver's license.

13 (d) No holder of a certificate shall violate any
14 restriction placed on the certificate. Depending upon the
15 type of vehicle used in the driving test and the abilities
16 and physical condition of the applicant, the Department
17 of the California Highway Patrol and the department
18 may place restrictions on a certificate to assure the safe
19 operation of a motor vehicle and safe transportation of
20 passengers. These restrictions may include, but are not
21 limited to, all of the following:

- 22 (1) Automatic transmission only.
- 23 (2) Hydraulic brakes only.
- 24 (3) Type 2 bus only.
- 25 (4) Conventional or type 2 bus only.
- 26 (5) Two-axle motor truck or passenger vehicle only.

27 (e) No holder of a certificate shall drive any motor
28 vehicle equipped with a two-speed rear axle unless the
29 certificate is endorsed: "May drive vehicle with
30 two-speed rear axle."

31 SEC. 2. Section 12520 of the Vehicle Code is amended
32 to read:

33 12520. (a) No person employed as a tow truck driver,
34 as defined in Section 2430.1, shall operate a tow truck
35 unless that person has, in his or her immediate possession,
36 a valid California driver's license of an appropriate class
37 for the vehicle to be driven, and a tow truck driver
38 certificate issued by the department or a temporary tow
39 truck driver certificate issued by the Department of the



1 California Highway Patrol, to permit the operation of the
2 tow truck.

3 (b) When notified that the applicant has been cleared
4 through the Department of Justice or the Federal Bureau
5 of Investigation, or both, and if the applicant meets all
6 other applicable provisions of this code, the department
7 shall issue a permanent tow truck driver certificate. The
8 permanent tow truck driver certificate shall be valid for
9 a maximum of five years and shall expire on the same date
10 as that of the applicant’s driver’s license.

11 SEC. 3. Section 12527 of the Vehicle Code is amended
12 to read:

13 12527. In addition to satisfying all requirements
14 specified in this code and regulations adopted pursuant
15 to this code, an applicant for an ambulance driver
16 certificate shall satisfy all of the following requirements:

17 (a) Except as otherwise provided, every ambulance
18 driver responding to an emergency call or transporting
19 patients shall be at least 18 years of age, hold a driver’s
20 license valid in California, possess a valid ambulance
21 driver certificate, and be trained and competent in
22 ambulance operation and the use of safety and
23 emergency care equipment required by the California
24 Code of Regulations governing ambulances.

25 (b) Except as provided in subdivision (f), no person
26 shall operate an ambulance unless the person has in his or
27 her immediate possession a driver’s license for the
28 appropriate class of vehicle to be driven, and a certificate
29 issued by the department to permit the operation of an
30 ambulance.

31 (c) An ambulance driver certificate may be issued by
32 the department only upon the successful completion of
33 an examination conducted by the department and
34 subject to all of the following conditions:

35 (1) An applicant for an original or renewal driver
36 certificate shall submit a report of medical examination
37 on a form approved by the department, the Federal
38 Highway Administration, or the Federal Aviation
39 Administration. The report shall be dated within the two
40 years preceding the application date.



1 (2) An applicant for an original driver certificate shall
2 submit an acceptable fingerprint card.

3 (3) The certificate to drive an ambulance shall be valid
4 for a period not exceeding five years and six months and
5 shall expire on the same date as the driver's license. The
6 ambulance driver certificate shall be valid only when
7 both of the following conditions exist:

8 (A) The certificate is accompanied by a medical
9 examination certificate that was issued within the
10 preceding two years and approved by the department,
11 Federal Highway Administration, or Federal Aviation
12 Administration.

13 (B) A copy of the medical examination report from
14 which the certificate was issued is on file with the
15 department.

16 (4) The ambulance driver certificate is renewable
17 under conditions prescribed by the department. Except
18 as permitted under paragraphs (2) and (3) of subdivision
19 (d), applicants renewing an ambulance driver certificate
20 shall possess certificates or licenses evidencing
21 compliance with the emergency medical training and
22 educational standards for ambulance attendants
23 established by the Emergency Medical Service
24 Authority.

25 (d) (1) Every ambulance driver shall have been
26 trained to assist the ambulance attendant in the care and
27 handling of the ill and injured.

28 Except as provided in paragraph (2), the driver of a
29 California-based ambulance shall, within one year of
30 initial issuance of the driver's ambulance driver
31 certificate, possess a certificate or license evidencing
32 compliance with the emergency medical training and
33 educational standards established for ambulance
34 attendants by the Emergency Medical Service Authority.
35 In those emergencies requiring both the regularly
36 assigned driver and attendant to be utilized in providing
37 patient care, the specialized emergency medical training
38 requirement shall not apply to persons temporarily
39 detailed to drive the ambulance.



1 (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to an ambulance
2 driver who is a volunteer driver for a volunteer
3 ambulance service under the circumstances specified in
4 this paragraph, if the service is provided in the
5 unincorporated areas of a county with a population of less
6 than 125,000 persons, as determined by the most recent
7 federal decennial census. The operation of an ambulance
8 under this paragraph shall only apply if the name of the
9 driver and the volunteer ambulance service and facts
10 substantiating the public health necessity for an
11 exemption are submitted to the department by the
12 county board of supervisors and by at least one of the
13 following entities in the county where the driver operates
14 the ambulance:

15 (A) The county health officer.

16 (B) The county medical care committee.

17 (C) The local emergency medical services agency
18 coordinator.

19 (3) The information required by paragraph (2) shall
20 be submitted to the department at the time of application
21 for an ambulance driver certificate. Upon receipt of that
22 information, the department shall restrict the certificate
23 holder to driving an ambulance for the volunteer
24 ambulance service.

25 (4) The director may terminate any certificate issued
26 pursuant to paragraph (2) at any time the department
27 determines that the qualifying conditions specified
28 therein no longer exist.

29 (5) The exemption granted pursuant to paragraph (2)
30 shall expire on the expiration date of the ambulance
31 driver certificate.

32 (e) A person holding a valid certificate to permit the
33 operation of an ambulance, issued prior to January 1, 1991,
34 shall not be required to reapply for a certificate to satisfy
35 the requirements of this section until the certificate he or
36 she holds expires or is canceled or revoked.

37 (f) An ambulance certificate is not required for
38 persons operating ambulances in the line of duty as
39 salaried, regular, full-time police officers, deputy sheriffs,
40 or members of a fire department of a public agency. This



1 exemption does not include volunteers and part-time
2 employees or members of a department whose duties are
3 primarily clerical or administrative.

4 SEC. 4. Section 12804.6 of the Vehicle Code is
5 amended to read:

6 12804.6. (a) No person shall operate a transit bus
7 transporting passengers unless that person has received
8 from the department a certificate to operate a transit bus
9 or is certified to drive a schoolbus or school pupil activity
10 bus pursuant to Section 12517.

11 (b) All transit busdrivers shall comply with standards
12 established in Section 40083 of the Education Code. The
13 Department of Motor Vehicles shall establish an
14 implementation program for transit busdrivers to meet
15 these requirements. Any transit busdriver who was
16 employed as a busdriver on or before July 1, 1990, shall
17 comply with Section 40085.5 of the Education Code
18 instead of Section 44083 of that code in order to receive
19 his or her original certificate.

20 (c) Implementation procedures for the issuance of
21 transit busdrivers' certificates may be established by the
22 Department of Motor Vehicles as necessary to implement
23 an orderly transit busdriver training program.

24 (d) The department shall issue a transit busdriver
25 certificate to any person who provides either of the
26 following:

27 (1) Proof that he or she has complied with Section
28 40083 of the Education Code.

29 (2) Proof that he or she has complied with Section
30 40085.5 of the Education Code.

31 (e) The department may charge a fee of ten dollars
32 (\$10) to an applicant for an original or a duplicate or
33 renewal certificate under this section.

34 (f) The department shall issue a certificate to the
35 applicant. The status of the certificate shall also become
36 part of the pull notice and periodic reports issued
37 pursuant to Section 1808.1. The certificate or the pull
38 notice or periodic reports shall become part of, the
39 person's employee records for the purpose of inspection
40 pursuant to Sections 1808.1 and 34501. It shall be unlawful



1 for the employer to permit a person to drive a transit bus
2 who does not have a valid certificate.

3 (g) The term of a certificate shall be a period not to
4 exceed five years, and shall expire with the driver's
5 license.

6 SEC. 5. Section 12814.5 of the Vehicle Code is
7 amended to read:

8 12814.5. (a) The director may establish a program to
9 evaluate the traffic safety and other effects of renewing
10 driver's licenses by mail. Pursuant to that program, the
11 department may renew by mail driver's licenses for
12 licensees not holding a probationary license, and whose
13 records, for the two years immediately preceding the
14 determination of eligibility for the renewal, show no
15 notification of a violation of subdivision (a) of Section
16 40509, a total violation point count not greater than one
17 as determined in accordance with Section 12810, no
18 suspension of the driving privilege pursuant to Section
19 13353.2, and no refusal to submit to or complete chemical
20 testing pursuant to Section 13353 or 13353.1.

21 (b) The director may terminate the renewal by mail
22 program authorized by this section at any time the
23 department determines that the program has an adverse
24 impact on traffic safety.

25 (c) No renewal by mail shall be granted to any person
26 who is 70 years of age or older.

27 (d) (1) The department shall charge a fee of twelve
28 dollars (\$12) for each noncommercial license renewal
29 and twenty-seven dollars (\$27) for each commercial
30 license or noncommercial firefighter license renewal
31 granted pursuant to subdivision (a) which expires on the
32 fourth birthday following the date of the application.

33 (2) The department shall charge a fee of fifteen dollars
34 (\$15) for each noncommercial license renewal and
35 thirty-four dollars (\$34) for each commercial license or
36 noncommercial firefighter license renewal granted
37 pursuant to subdivision (a) which expires on the fifth
38 birthday following the date of the application.

39 (e) The department shall notify each licensee granted
40 a renewal by mail pursuant to this section of major



1 changes to the Vehicle Code affecting traffic laws
2 occurring during the prior five-year period.

3 (f) The department shall not renew a driver's license
4 by mail if the license has been previously renewed by mail
5 two consecutive times for five-year periods.

6 SEC. 6. Section 12816 of the Vehicle Code is amended
7 to read:

8 12816. (a) Every original driver's license expires on
9 the fifth birthday of the applicant following the date of
10 the application for the license.

11 (b) Renewal of a driver's license shall be made for a
12 term which expires on the fifth birthday of the applicant
13 following the expiration of the license renewed, if
14 application for renewal is made within six months prior
15 to the expiration of the license to be renewed, or within
16 90 days after expiration of the license. If renewal is not
17 applied for within 90 days after expiration of the license,
18 the application and fee is considered the same as an
19 application for an original license.

20 (c) The department may accept application for a
21 renewal of a driver's license made more than six months
22 prior to the date of expiration. The renewal shall be made
23 for a term which expires on the fifth birthday of the
24 applicant following the date of the application for the
25 renewal license.

26 (d) The department may accept an application for a
27 license of a different class made more than six months
28 before the expiration of the license previously issued, if
29 the previously issued license is surrendered for
30 cancellation in accordance with Section 13100. The
31 driver's license issued from that application expires on
32 the fifth birthday of the applicant following the date of
33 the application.

34 (e) Notwithstanding subdivisions (a), (b), (c), and
35 (d), the department may adjust the expiration date for
36 any driver's license issued pursuant to this code.

37 SEC. 7. Section 14900 of the Vehicle Code is amended
38 to read:

39 14900. Upon application for an original class C or M
40 driver's license, or for the renewal of a class C or M



1 driver's license, there shall be paid to the department a
2 fee of twelve dollars (\$12) for a license that will expire on
3 the fourth birthday of the applicant following the date of
4 the application. The payment of the fee entitles the
5 person paying the fee to apply for a driver's license and
6 to take three examinations within a period of 12 months
7 from the date of the application or during the period that
8 an instruction permit is valid, as provided in Section
9 12509.

10 SEC. 8. Section 14900.1 of the Vehicle Code is
11 amended to read:

12 14900.1. Except as provided in Sections 15250.5 and
13 15255, upon application for an original driver's license, or
14 for the renewal of a driver's license or for a license to
15 operate a different class of vehicle, there shall be paid to
16 the department a fee of fifteen dollars (\$15) for a license
17 that will expire on the fifth birthday of the applicant
18 following the date of the application. The payment of the
19 fee entitles the person paying the fee to apply for a
20 driver's license and to take three examinations within a
21 period of 12 months from the date of the application or
22 during the period that an instruction permit is valid, as
23 provided in Section 12509.

24 SEC. 9. Section 14901 of the Vehicle Code is amended
25 to read:

26 14901. Upon an application for a duplicate driver's
27 license or for a change of name on a driver's license, there
28 shall be paid the department a fee of twelve dollars (\$12).

29 SEC. 10. Section 14901.1 of the Vehicle Code is
30 repealed.

31 SEC. 11. Section 15250.5 of the Vehicle Code is
32 amended to read:

33 15250.5. (a) No person shall operate firefighting
34 equipment unless that person has in his or her immediate
35 possession a valid driver's license for the appropriate class
36 of vehicle operated, or a license issued pursuant to
37 subdivision (b).

38 (b) The department may issue a restricted driver's
39 license for the appropriate class of vehicle to a firefighter
40 for the operation of firefighting equipment. The



1 restricted license shall be valid only for operating (1)
2 firefighting equipment within this state, or in another
3 state during a response under a mutual aid pact, or (2)
4 any vehicle for which a class C driver's license is required.

5 (c) The restricted firefighter's license may be issued
6 only to an applicant qualified by examination prescribed
7 and conducted by the department.

8 The pretrip inspection and driving test required to
9 receive the license shall be the same as required to obtain
10 a license under Section 15250.

11 The written examination shall be developed by the
12 department with the cooperation of the State Fire
13 Marshal. The department shall include a sufficient
14 number of questions from the examinations required to
15 obtain a license under Section 15250 to ensure that
16 passing the special examination under this section assures
17 a level of safety comparable to examinations given under
18 Section 15250.

19 (d) In lieu of a report of medical examination required
20 by Section 12804.9, an applicant for a restricted license
21 issued pursuant to subdivision (b) shall, upon application

31 (f) A "firefighter" is any person employed as a
32 firefighter by a federal or state agency or by a regularly
33 organized fire department of a city, county, city and
34 county, or district, or registered as a volunteer member
35 of a regularly organized fire department having official
36 recognition of the city, county, city and county, or district
37 in which the department is located.

38 (g) "Firefighting equipment" means a motor vehicle
39 used to travel to and to ~~suppress fires, or to transport~~
40 ~~equipment used to suppress fires~~ *from the scene of any*



1 *emergency situation, or to transport equipment used in*
2 *the control of any emergency situation, and which is*
3 *owned by, or under the exclusive control of, a federal or*
4 *state agency, a regularly organized fire department of a*
5 *city, county, city and county, or district, or a volunteer*
6 *fire department having official recognition of the city,*
7 *county, city and county, or district in which the*
8 *department is located.*

9 (h) For purposes of the penalties and sanctions
10 prescribed by Article 7 (commencing with Section
11 15300), the operation of firefighting equipment under a
12 license issued pursuant to subdivision (b) is deemed to be
13 the operation of a commercial motor vehicle.

14 SEC. 12. Section 15250.6 of the Vehicle Code is
15 amended to read:

16 15250.6. (a) No person shall operate firefighting
17 equipment unless that person has in his or her immediate
18 possession a valid driver's license for the appropriate class
19 of vehicle operated, or a license issued pursuant to
20 subdivision (b).

21 (b) The department may issue a restricted driver's
22 license for the appropriate class of vehicle to a firefighter
23 for the operation of firefighting equipment. The
24 restricted license shall be valid only for operating (1)
25 firefighting equipment within this state, or in another
26 state during a response under a mutual aid pact, or (2)
27 any vehicle for which a class C driver's license is required.

28 (c) The restricted firefighter's license may be issued
29 only to an applicant qualified by examination prescribed
30 and conducted by the department.

31 The pretrip inspection and driving test required to
32 receive the license shall be the same as required to obtain
33 a license under Section 15250.

34 The written examination shall be developed by the
35 department with the cooperation of the State Fire
36 Marshal. The department shall include a sufficient
37 number of questions from the examinations required to
38 obtain a license under Section 15250 to ensure that
39 passing the special examination under this section assures



1 a level of safety comparable to examinations given under
2 Section 15250.

3 (d) In lieu of a report of medical examination required

16 firefighter by a federal or state agency or by a regularly
17 organized fire department of a city, county, city and
18 county, or district, or registered as a volunteer member
19 of a regularly organized fire department having official
20 recognition of the city, county, city and county, or district
21 in which the department is located.

22 (g) "Firefighting equipment" means a motor vehicle
23 used to travel to and to ~~suppress fires, or to transport~~
24 ~~equipment used to suppress fires from the scene of any~~
25 *emergency situation, or to transport equipment used in*
26 *the control of any emergency situation*, and which is
27 owned by, or under the exclusive control of, a federal or
28 state agency, a regularly organized fire department of a
29 city, county, city and county, or district, or a volunteer
30 fire department having official recognition of the city,
31 county, city and county, or district in which the
32 department is located.

33 (h) For purposes of the penalties and sanctions
34 prescribed by Article 7 (commencing with Section
35 15300), the operation of firefighting equipment under a
36 license issued pursuant to subdivision (b) is deemed to be
37 the operation of a commercial motor vehicle.

38 SEC. 13. Section 15250.7 is added to the Vehicle Code,
39 to read:



1 15250.7. Upon application for issuance of a duplicate
2 driver’s license pursuant to subdivision (b) of Section
3 15250.5 or subdivision (b) of Section 15250.6, there shall
4 be paid to the department a fee of twenty-seven dollars
5 (\$27).

6 SEC. 14. Section 15255 of the Vehicle Code is
7 amended to read:

8 15255. (a) Except as otherwise specified in
9 subdivisions (b) and (c), upon an application for an
10 original commercial driver’s license, there shall be paid
11 to the department a fee of fifty-seven dollars (\$57) for a
12 license that will expire on the fourth birthday of the
13 applicant following the date of the application. A fee of
14 fifty-seven dollars (\$57) shall also be paid to the
15 department upon an application to change a license
16 classification or to remove a restriction if the change or
17 removal requires a driving-skill test and the license will
18 expire on the fourth birthday of the applicant following
19 the date of the application.

20 (b) Upon application for issuance of an original
21 commercial driver’s license or for the renewal of a
22 commercial driver’s license by a currently licensed class
23 A or class B driver who meets the driver record
24 requirements and all other requirements established by
25 Section 383.77 of Title 49 of the Code of Federal
26 Regulations, there shall be paid to the department a fee
27 of twenty-seven dollars (\$27) for a license that will expire
28 on the fourth birthday of the applicant following the date
29 of the application.

30 (c) Upon application for an original class C
31 commercial driver’s license or for the renewal of a class
32 C commercial driver’s license which requires an
33 endorsement as provided in Section 15278, there shall be
34 paid to the department a fee of twenty-seven dollars
35 (\$27) for a license that will expire on the fourth birthday
36 of the applicant following the date of the application.

37 (d) Following failure in taking a driving-skill test,
38 there shall be paid to the department a fee of thirty
39 dollars (\$30) for each subsequent administration of the
40 driving-skill test required by the application.



1 SEC. 15. Section 15255.1 of the Vehicle Code is
2 amended to read:

3 15255.1. (a) Except as otherwise specified in
4 subdivisions (b) and (c), upon an application for an
5 original commercial driver's license, there shall be paid
6 to the department a fee of sixty-four dollars (\$64) for a
7 license that will expire on the fifth birthday of the
8 applicant following the date of the application. A fee of
9 sixty-four dollars (\$64) shall also be paid to the
10 department upon an application to change a license
11 classification or to remove a restriction if the change or
12 removal requires a driving-skill test and the license will
13 expire on the fifth birthday of the applicant following the
14 date of the application.

15 (b) Upon application for an original commercial
16 driver's license or for the renewal of commercial driver's
17 license by a currently licensed class A or class B, or class
18 A or class B, driver who meets the driver record
19 requirements and all other requirements established by
20 Section 383.77 of Title 49 of the Code of Federal
21 Regulations, there shall be paid to the department a fee
22 of thirty-four dollars (\$34) for a license that will expire on
23 the fifth birthday of the applicant following the date of
24 the application.

25 (c) Upon application for an original class C
26 commercial driver's license or for the renewal of a class
27 C commercial driver's license which requires an
28 endorsement as provided in Section 15278, there shall be
29 paid to the department a fee of thirty-four dollars (\$34)
30 for a license that will expire on the fifth birthday of the
31 applicant following the date of the application.

32 (d) Following failure in taking a driving-skill test,
33 there shall be paid to the department a fee of thirty
