

**ASSEMBLY BILL**

**No. 1671**

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**Introduced by Assembly Member Keeley**

January 14, 1998

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An act to amend Sections 7550.5, 63041, 63042, and 65040.1 of, and to repeal Article 5 (commencing with Section 65041) of Chapter 1.5 of Division 1 of Title 7 of, the Government Code, to amend Sections 5096.88 and 6370.1 of, to amend the heading of Division 13.5 (commencing with Section 21190) of, to add a chapter heading immediately preceding Section 21190 of, and to add Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 21200) to Division 13.5 of, the Public Resources Code, relating to the environment, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1671, as introduced, Keeley. State Environmental Goals and Policy Report.

Existing law requires the Governor to prepare and thereafter maintain, regularly review, and revise a comprehensive State Environmental Goals and Policy Report.

This bill would, instead, require that report to be prepared and thereafter to be maintained, regularly reviewed, and revised by the Secretary of the Resources Agency. This bill would also recodify those provisions in the Public Resources Code and make conforming changes.

The bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.
