An act relating to local government, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2796, as introduced, Committee on Budget. Local government.

This bill would express the intent of the Legislature in enacting its provisions to make the necessary statutory changes to implement the Budget Act of 1998 relative to local government.

This bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

Vote: $\frac{2}{3}$. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. It is the intent of the Legislature in
2 enacting this act to make the necessary statutory changes
3 to implement the Budget Act of 1998 relative to local
4 government.

1 SEC. 2. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the
2 immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or
3 safety within the meaning of Article IV of the
4 Constitution and shall go into immediate effect. The facts
5 constituting the necessity are:

6 In order to make the necessary statutory changes to
7 implement the Budget Act of 1998 at the earliest possible
8 time, it is necessary that this act take effect immediately.
