SENATE BILL

No. 687

An act relating to health, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 687, as amended, Hughes. Health.

The Budget Act of 1998 contains appropriations for breast cancer early detection services and for the Expanded Access to Primary Care Program.

This bill would appropriate \$13,218,000 for specified health purposes, including \$4,209,000 from the Health Education Account in the Cigarette and Tobacco Products Surtax Fund

to augment that appropriation, \$9,200,000 from the General Fund to the State Department of Health Services to augment the Budget Act of 1998 appropriation to the State Department of Health Services for the Expanded Access to Primary Care Program, and \$1,800,000 from the General Fund to the State Department of Health Services for the provision of health care to children in the Children’s Treatment Program.

The bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated the sum of
 2 thirteen million two hundred eighteen thousand dollars
 3 (\$13,218,000) as follows:

4 (a) The sum of four million two hundred nine
 5 thousand dollars (\$4,209,000) from the Unallocated
 6 Account in the Cigarette and Tobacco Products Surtax
 7 Fund, to the State Department of Health Services *to fund*
 8 *the Breast Cancer Early Detection Program*. Of this
 9 amount, seven hundred ninety-four thousand dollars
 10 (\$794,000) is allocated for support, in augmentation of
 11 Item 4260-001-0236, and three million four hundred
 12 fifteen thousand dollars (\$3,415,000) is allocated for local
 13 assistance, in augmentation of Item 4260-111-0236, of the
 14 Budget Act of 1998, Chapter 324 of the Statutes of 1998.

15 (b) The sum of seven million two hundred nine
 16 thousand dollars (\$7,209,000) from the General Fund to
 17 the State Department of Health Services for the
 18 Expanded Access to Primary Care Program provided for
 19 by Article 2 (commencing with Section 124900) of
 20 Chapter 7 of Part 1 of Division 106 of the Health and
 21 Safety Code in augmentation of local assistance Item
 22 4260-111-001 of the Budget Act of 1998.

23 (c) The sum of one million eight hundred thousand
 24 dollars (\$1,800,000) from the General Fund to the State
 25 Department of Health Services for deposit in the CHDP
 26 Treatment Account established pursuant to Section



1 16934.5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code for the
2 provisions of health care services in the Children's
3 Treatment Program.

4 SEC. 2. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the
5 immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or
6 safety within the meaning of Article IV of the
7 Constitution and shall go into immediate effect. The facts
8 constituting the necessity are:

9 In order to timely apply the funding contained in this
10 act to the 1998-99 fiscal year, it is necessary that this act
11 take effect immediately.
