An act to add Chapter 2.5 (commencing with Section 13330) to Title 3 of Part 4 of the Penal Code, relating to crime prevention, and making an appropriation therefor.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1568, as amended, Granlund. Crime prevention: law enforcement information system.

Existing law requires the Department of Justice to maintain state summary criminal history information, which is defined to mean the master record of information compiled by the Attorney General pertaining to the identification and criminal history of any person, including name, date of birth, fingerprints, and photographs.

This bill would ~~express the intent of the Legislature to~~ establish a ~~pilot~~ model program that would expand the Automated Regional Justice Information System (ARJIS) beyond San Diego County to *southern California counties, including, but not limited to, Riverside, San Bernardino, Orange, and Los Angeles Counties*, to provide a basis for all state and local law enforcement agencies to have the opportunity to access data contained in an integrated law enforcement information and analysis system. *The bill additionally would create a regional advisory board, to*

perform specified functions in connection with the implementation of this program. The bill also would express the further intent of the Legislature that funds be appropriated appropriate the sum of \$16,000,000 from the annual Budget Act General Fund to establish a pilot model program that would expand ARJIS beyond San Diego County and provide assistance to jurisdictions that wish to integrate into the system to southern California counties, including, but not limited to, Riverside, San Bernardino, Orange, and Los Angeles Counties.

4 *13331. A regional advisory board shall be created to*
5 *set the interface protocols and priorities for*
6 *implementation of the program described in Section*
7 *13330. Each California Law Enforcement*
8 *Telecommunications System (CLETS) point of presence*
9 *within each of the participating counties shall have one*
10 *representative on the board. The interconnectivity of this*
11 *program shall be a web-based system using the*
12 *CLETS-wide area network. The board shall make an*
13 *assessment of the throughput capability and set priorities*
14 *based on the efficient supply of data to frontline law*
15 *enforcement officers. The program shall also recognize*
16 *the needs of the public and, where possible, the protocols*
17 *shall be developed to enhance community-based policing*
18 *operations through the sharing of information.*

19 *SEC. 2. The sum of sixteen million dollars*
20 *(\$16,000,000) is hereby appropriated from the General*
21 *Fund for the costs of the program established pursuant to*
22 *this chapter.*
