An act to ~~amend Item 6610-001-0001 of Section 2.00 of Chapter 50 of the Statutes of 1999, relating to~~ *add Chapter 4.8 (commencing with Section 89450) to Part 55 of the Education Code, relating to education, and making an appropriation therefor.*

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 679, as amended, Johnston. Education: *California State University.*

Existing law requires the California State University to offer undergraduate and graduate instruction through the master's degree in the liberal arts and sciences and professional education. Existing law authorizes research, scholarship, and

creative activity in support of the university's undergraduate and graduate instructional mission.

This bill would appropriate \$1,600,000 from the General Fund to the Trustees of the California State University for allocation in the 1999–2000 fiscal year. Of that amount, \$1,300,000 would be allocated to California State University, Stanislaus, for expenditure for maintenance and operation of physical facilities located on the site of the Stockton Development Center; and \$300,000 would be allocated to the trustees for purposes of funding a feasibility study regarding the site to be conducted by the trustees, the Department of General Services, the Department of Finance, and the City of Stockton, as required by the bill. The study would be required to be completed by September 1, 2000.

~~The Budget Act of 1999 appropriates, among other amounts, \$2,190,847,000 for support of the California State University. Of this amount, the act specifies that \$1,700,000 is for conversion of the Stockton Developmental Center into the Regional and Continuing Education Center at California State University, Stanislaus. The Budget Act of 1999 also declares the intent of the Legislature to annually provide funds for this purpose through the 2001–02 fiscal year.~~

~~This bill would delete the reference to the 2001–02 fiscal year from this declaration of legislative intent.~~

~~(2) Existing law establishes public postsecondary, secondary, and elementary schools throughout the state. Among the public postsecondary schools are the various institutions that comprise the California State University system. The public secondary and elementary schools are administered by the various school districts and county offices of education.~~

~~This bill would appropriate, without regard to fiscal year, \$2,300,000 from the General Fund. Of this amount, \$1,300,000 would be appropriated to the Trustees of the California State University for allocation for the continuing conversion of the Stockton Developmental Center into the Regional and Continuing Education Center at California State University, Stanislaus. The bill would appropriate the remaining \$1,000,000 to the Superintendent of Public Instruction for allocation, in accordance with specified criteria, to school~~



~~districts and county offices of education to fund the acquisition of school library materials. To the extent that the \$1,000,000 amount is allocated to school districts, these funds would be applied toward the minimum funding requirements for school districts and community college districts imposed by Section 8 of Article XVI of the California Constitution.~~

8 *89450. The Legislature finds and declares all of the*
9 *following:*

10 *(a) There is a need for the California State University*
11 *to continue development of a reuse plan for the site of the*
12 *former Stockton Development Center, the property of*
13 *which has been conveyed to the trustees for public school*
14 *purposes.*

15 *(b) The establishment of an educationally focused*
16 *campus consisting of public-public and public-private*
17 *partnerships will result in greater educational*
18 *opportunities for the residents of San Joaquin County and*
19 *in economic development opportunities for the City of*
20 *Stockton.*

21 *(c) To facilitate the reuse of the site, it is necessary to*
22 *provide funding for the maintenance of physical facilities*
23 *on the site and for a study to explore the long-term*
24 *feasibility of reusing the site in the prescribed manner.*

25 *89451. It is the intent of the Legislature that the*
26 *Stockton Development Center be a productive asset*
27 *focused on educationally based programs. Further, it is*
28 *the intent of the Legislature to supplement state*



1 resources in site maintenance through public-public and
2 public-private partnerships.

3 89452. (a) The trustees, the Department of General
4 Services, the Department of Finance, and the City of
5 Stockton shall prepare a long-term feasibility study
6 regarding the reuse of the site. The study shall include
7 consideration of the state resources necessary to develop
8 the site in the future. The study shall be completed by
9 September 1, 2000.

10 SEC. 2. The sum of one million six hundred thousand
11 dollars (\$1,600,000) is hereby appropriated for
12 expenditure, without regard to fiscal year, from the
13 General Fund to the Trustees of the California State
14 University for allocation in the 1999–2000 fiscal year as
15 follows:

16 (a) One million three hundred thousand dollars
17 (\$1,300,000) to California State University, Stanislaus, for
18 expenditure for maintenance and operation of physical
19 facilities located on the site of the Stockton Development
20 Center, as set forth in Chapter 4.8 (commencing with
21 Section 89450) of Part 55 of the Education Code.

22 (b) Three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) to the
23 trustees for purposes of funding the feasibility study
24 required by Section 89452 of the Education Code.

25 SEC. 3. It is the intent of the Legislature that funding
26 for purposes of Chapter 4.8 (commencing with Section
27 89450) of Part 55 of the Education Code in the 2000–01
28 fiscal year be provided in the Budget Act or in another
29 act.

Of the amount appropriated in this item, \$65,647,000 is provided for student financial aid grants, including \$48,285,000 for State University grants and \$17,362,000 for grants pursuant to the California State University Educational Opportunity Program. These financial aid funds shall be provided to needy students according to the nationally accepted needs analysis methodology.~~

~~SEC. 2. The sum of two million three hundred thousand dollars (\$2,300,000) is hereby appropriated for expenditure, without regard to fiscal year, from the General Fund in accordance with the following schedule:~~

~~(a) One million three hundred thousand dollars (\$1,300,000) to the Trustees of the California State University, for allocation for the continuing conversion of the Stockton Developmental Center into the Regional and Continuing Education Center at California State University, Stanislaus.~~

~~(b) One million dollars (\$1,000,000) to the Superintendent of Public Instruction, for allocation, as an equal amount per unit of regular average daily attendance, to school districts and county offices of education to fund the acquisition of school library materials pursuant to Article 7 (commencing with Section 18180) of Chapter 2 of Part 11 of the Education Code. Each school district and county office of education to which an allocation is made under this subdivision shall meet all of the following criteria:~~

~~(1) The school district or county office of education did not receive an allocation for the 1998-99 fiscal year from funds appropriated pursuant to Item 6110-149-0001 of Section 2.00 of the Budget Act of 1998.~~

~~(2) The school district or county office of education has approved a districtwide school library plan pursuant to Section 18181 of the Education Code.~~
