**SENATE BILL**

An act relating to state funds, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1028, as amended, Speier. State budget: nonprofit vendors.

Under the California Constitution, funds may only be drawn from the State Treasury through an appropriation made by law and upon a Controller's duly drawn warrant.

This bill would appropriate to the Controller from the General Fund and any appropriate special fund an amount no greater than that necessary to enable the Controller to compensate any nonprofit vendor who contracted with the state prior to July 1, 1999, for goods delivered or services rendered for a term that includes any portion of the 1999-2000 fiscal year until the date that the Budget Act of 1999 is enacted.

The bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

Vote:  $\frac{2}{3}$ . Appropriation: yes. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated from the  
2 General Fund and any appropriate special fund to the  
3 Controller, and the Controller may expend, an amount no  
4 greater than that necessary to enable the Controller to  
5 compensate any nonprofit vendor who contracted with  
6 the state prior to July 1, 1999, for goods delivered or  
7 services rendered for a term that includes any portion of  
8 the 1999–2000 fiscal year, until the date that the Budget  
9 Act of 1999 is enacted.

10 SEC. 2. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the  
11 immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or  
12 safety within the meaning of Article IV of the  
13 Constitution and shall go into immediate effect. The facts  
14 constituting the necessity are:

15 In order to pay nonprofit vendors who contracted with  
16 the state prior to July 1, 1999, for goods to be delivered or  
17 services rendered after that date *and* who have  
18 performed in whole or in part on their contracts, but  
19 cannot otherwise be paid because the Budget Act of 1999  
20 has not been enacted, it is necessary for this act to take  
21 effect immediately.
