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An act to add Section 52057.1 to the Education Code, relating to school finance.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1548, as introduced, Schiff. School finance: categorical programs.

Existing law requires the State Board of Education to establish a program to provide monetary and nonmonetary awards to schools that demonstrate certain academic achievement.

This bill would authorize a school district or charter school that has a significant number of schoolsites eligible to participate in the program to elect to receive its categorical apportionment for certain categorical programs as a block grant amount.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 52057.1 is added to the  
2 Education Code, to read:  
3 52057.1. (a) A school district or charter school that  
4 has a significant number of its schoolsites eligible to  
5 participate in the Governor's Performance Award  
6 Program established in Section 52057 may elect to receive  
7 its categorical apportionment for the programs contained

1 in subdivision (d) as a block grant amount regardless of  
2 implementation or nonimplementation of the categorical  
3 programs.

4 (b) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall  
5 annually compute a categorical block grant amount for  
6 each school district or charter school as set forth in this  
7 section.

8 (c) The superintendent shall compute, as of June 30,  
9 1999, the estimated statewide average amount of funding  
10 for other state categorical aid per unit of average daily  
11 attendance received by school districts in 1998–99, for  
12 each of four grade level ranges: kindergarten and grades  
13 1, 2, and 3; grades 4, 5, and 6; grades 7 and 8; and grades  
14 9 to 12, inclusive.
