## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

An act relating to corrections, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

## LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1831, Burton. Corrections: funding.

Existing provisions of the Budget Act of 2000 make various appropriations for the support of state government.

This bill would provide that certain funds appropriated by that act to the Secretary of the Youth and Adult Correctional Agency are first-year funding for a prescribed 4-year epidemiological treatment prevention study. The bill would require the secretary to report findings and recommendations to the Legislature by August 1, 2005. The bill would also appropriate \$125,000 from the General Fund to the Department of Corrections for preliminary plans for a new medical examination facility at the California Medical Facility at Vacaville.

The bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

Appropriation: yes.

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The funds appropriated in Item 0550-001-0001 of the Budget Act of 2000 (Ch. 52, Stats. 2000) for the support of the Secretary for Youth and Adult Correctional Agency shall constitute the first year of funding for a four-year epidemiological treatment prevention study. Notwithstanding Provision 1 of Item 0550-001-0001 of the Budget Act of 2000, the secretary shall report to the Legislature with findings and recommendations related to the study no later than August 1, 2005. Notwithstanding Provision 1 of Item 0550-001-0001 of the Budget Act of 2000, the funds



appropriated in Item 0550-001-0001 are appropriated for use and expenditure for the 2000–01 fiscal year.

SEC. 2. One hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Corrections for preliminary plans for a new medical examination facility at the California Medical Facility in Vacaville.

SEC. 3. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety within the meaning of Article IV of the Constitution and shall go into immediate effect. The facts constituting the necessity are:

In order to provide security related improvements at correctional facilities to preserve the public safety, it is necessary for this act to take effect immediately.
