Senate Bill 1247: By Senator Runner—An act to amend Section 11102.1 of the Penal Code, relating to fingerprinting.

Senate Bill 1248: By Senator Alquist—An act to amend Section 1599.1 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to long-term health care facilities.

Senate Bill 1249: By Senator Alquist—An act to amend Section 18724 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation.

Senate Bill 1250: By Senator Perata (Coauthor: Assembly Member Levine)—An act to amend Sections 399.6, 399.7, and 399.8 of, and to amend and repeal Sections 399 and 399.4 of, the Public Utilities Code, relating to energy, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

Senate Bill 1251: By Senator Alquist—An act to add and repeal Part 12 (commencing with Section 12999.25) of Division 6 of the Water Code, relating to water.

Senate Bill 1252: By Senator Florez—An act to add Section 42403.3 to the Health and Safety Code, relating to air pollution.

Senate Bill 1254: By Senator Ackerman—An act to amend Section 511 of the Labor Code, relating to employment.

Senate Bill 1255: By Senator Cox—An act to amend Section 20114 of the Public Contract Code, relating to local agency contracts.

Senate Bill 1256: By Senator Ackerman—An act to amend Section 351 of the Labor Code, relating to service gratuities.

Senate Bill 1257: By Senator Battin—An act to amend Section 68665 of the Government Code, and Section 1508 of the Penal Code, relating to criminal procedure.

Senate Constitutional Amendment 23: By Senator Morrow (Principal coauthor: Senator McClintock)—A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, by amending Sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, and 8 of, repealing Sections 9, 10, 12, and 13 of, and by repealing and adding Section 10.5 of, Article XIII B thereof, and by amending Section 8 of, and repealing Section 8.5 of, Article XVI thereof, relating to appropriations limitations.
