RE: AB 2347 (Harman): Letter to the Senate Daily Journal

Dear Secretary Schmidt:

I respectfully submit this letter to the Senate Daily Journal regarding my measure, AB 2347, Chapter 569, Statutes of 2006.

As the author of AB 2347, I note for the Senate Daily Journal that Probate Code Section 16374.5, as added by that measure, and effective January 1, 2007, establishes a default rule for the order of beneficiary distribution payments. According to the section, the default rule does not apply if (i) the governing instrument provides otherwise, (ii) the trustee otherwise determines, or (iii) the court otherwise orders. Under this measure, a trustee retains the discretion to apply a different order for beneficiary distribution payments than prescribed by the section.

Therefore, presuming that neither the governing instrument nor a court order provides otherwise, the statutory default rule would apply only where the trustee determined not to apply a different order of beneficiary distribution payments. It is important that trustees have the discretion to determine the appropriate order of beneficiary distribution payments. This is consistent with my intent in enacting the section and in accord with the section's language.
