Senate Bill 1193: By Senator Padilla—An act to amend Section 270 of, and to amend, renumber, and add Section 281 of, the Public Utilities Code, relating to telecommunications.

Senate Bill 1194: By Senator Battin—An act relating to taxation.

Senate Bill 1195: By Senator Battin—An act to amend Section 43013 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to air pollution.

Senate Bill 1196: By Senator Runner—An act to amend Section 27491 of the Government Code, relating to local government.
