Dear Senator Perata,

I authored Senate Bill (SB) 1171, pending in the Assembly Appropriations Committee, in order to close a “loophole” in the current



law that generally allows persons to carry loaded firearms in their vehicles in unincorporated areas of the state.

Current law prohibits a person from carrying a loaded firearm in a vehicle in an incorporated city. However, with regard to unincorporated areas, carrying a loaded firearm in a vehicle is only prohibited if a local ordinance prohibits the discharge of firearms in the area. SB 1171 closes this gap by prohibiting persons from carrying loaded firearms in their vehicles—regardless of whether they are in incorporated or unincorporated areas.

Current law also establishes a number of exemptions from this prohibition, in particular one for persons engaged in hunting, as specified. Recent amendments to SB 1171 make a number of changes to the hunting exemption.

I submit this Letter to the Journal to make clear that nothing in SB 1171 is intended to preclude a local government entity from enacting a local ordinance that is necessary to protect public safety, and only incidentally affects the field of hunting preempted by the Fish and Game Code.
