### INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF SENATE MEASURES

The following measures were introduced, read the first time and transmitted to the Committee on Rules for assignment:

**Senate Bill 49:** By Senator Dutton—An act to add and repeal Section 17059 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

**Senate Bill 50:** By Senator Corbett—An act to add Section 13957.3 to the Government Code, and to amend Sections 13823.95 and 13823.11 of the Penal Code, relating to victims of sexual assault.



**Senate Bill 51:** By Senator Ducheny (Coauthors: Assembly Members V. Manuel Pérez and Salas)—An act to add the heading to Article 1 (commencing with Section 2930) of, and to add Article 2 (commencing with Section 2940) to, Chapter 13 of Division 3 of, the Fish and Game Code, relating to the Salton Sea Restoration Council.

**Senate Concurrent Resolution 8:** By Senator Padilla—Relative to information and communication technologies digital literacy.
