Assembly Bill 746—An act to amend Section 1091.5 of the Government Code, relating to conflicts of interest.

Bill read second time.

Senate Bill 904: By Senator Hollingsworth—An act to amend Section 3242 of the Fish and Game Code, relating to hunting.

Senate Bill 905: By Senator Harman—An act to amend Section 3350 of the Public Resources Code, relating to oil and gas.

Senate Bill 906: By Senator Leno (Principal coauthor: Senator Kehoe) (Principal coauthor: Assembly Member Ammiano) (Coauthor: Senator Steinberg) (Coauthor: Assembly Member Jones)—An act to amend Sections 300, 400, 402, 420, 421, 422, 423, 425, and 426 of the Family Code, relating to marriage.

Senate Bill 907: By Senator Liu—An act to add Article 6 (commencing with Section 65050) to Chapter 1.5 of Division 1 of Title 7 to the Government Code, relating to the Office of Federal Funding Information and Assistance.

Senate Bill 908: By Senator Wyland—An act to amend Sections 226.7 and 512 of the Labor Code, relating to employment.

Senate Bill 909: By Senator Wright—An act to amend Sections 1786.16 and 1786.20 of the Civil Code, relating to personal information.

Senate Bill 910: By Senator Kehoe—An act relating to state claims and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

Senate Bill 911: By Senator Kehoe—An act relating to the payment of claims against the state, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

Senate Bill 409—An act to amend Section 13975 of, and to add Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 13985) to Part 4.5 of Division 3 of Title 2 of, the Government Code, and to amend Section 185020 of, and to add Section 185025 to, the Public Utilities Code, relating to transportation.

Senate Bill 700—An act to amend Sections 800, 803.1, 805, 805.1, 805.5, and 2027 of, and to add Sections 805.01 and 821.4 to, the Business and Professions Code, relating to healing arts.

Bill read second time, ordered engrossed, and to third reading.
