**Senate Bill 619**—An act to add Section 33319.4 to the Education Code, and to amend Section 19995 of the Government Code, relating to state employees.

The amendments proposed by the Committee on Education were read and adopted and the measure ordered printed, and re-referred to the Committee on Public Employment and Retirement.

**Senate Bill 353**—An act to add Section 1367.041 to the Health and Safety Code, and to add Sections 10127.45 and 10133.10 to the Insurance Code, relating to health care coverage.

Bill read second time.

The amendments proposed by the Committee on Health were read and adopted and the measure ordered printed, and re-referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

**Senate Bill 129**—An act to amend Section 2881 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to telecommunications, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
