Re: Letter to the Journal—California Clean Energy Jobs Act (Proposition 39, 2012)

Dear Mr. Schmidt:

On behalf of the Senate, I, along with Assemblymember Skinner on behalf of the Assembly, negotiated the agreement with the Governor on the implementation plan for the California Clean Energy Jobs Act (Proposition 39). The agreement funds energy projects at schools around the state upon approval of local expenditure plans.

My vote on the recently enacted budget trailer bill, SB 73, was cast with the understanding that the Legislature's intent was to ensure the benefits of the public funds from Proposition 39 benefit the schools rather than the facility owner, when school facilities are located in privately-owned spaces.

The trailer bill requires the California Energy Commission to define specified criteria and determine ways to calculate the cost savings and benefits of Prop. 39 projects. The trailer bill also provides that: "All benefits of these public funds should be received by the school utilizing the facility."
