JOHN A. CAPITMAN, has been appointed to the San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District Governing Board. Capitman has served in multiple positions at Fresno State University since 2005, including Nickerson distinguished professor in health policy and executive director of the Central Valley Health Policy Institute. He held multiple positions at Brandeis University from 1987 to 2004, including professor and director of long-term care studies at the Schneider Institutes for Health Policy and at Virginia Commonwealth University from 1983 to 1987, including health policy analyst for the Virginia Center on Aging and assistant professor in the Department of Health Administration and the Department of Gerontology. He was a principal investigator at Berkeley Planning Associates and an evaluation research consultant at the California Department of Health Services, Office of Long-Term Care and Aging from 1980 to 1983. Capitman was research director at the Center for Research in Social Dynamics from 1977 to 1979. He is co-founder and Board of Directors member of VISIONS Inc. Capitman earned a Doctor of Philosophy degree in psychology from Duke University. Appointed 02/04/2014. Effective 02/11/2014.

Member, San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District Governing Board, vice, Henry Forman, Ph.D., resigned, 01/22/2013. Term ending 01/01/2018.

RANDY SHORT, has been appointed to the California Boating and Waterways Commission. Short has been president of Almar Management Inc., a marina management company, since 2000, where he was chief operating officer from 1988 to 2000. He was mountain manager at Mammoth-June Ski Resort from 1985 to 1988. Short is a member of the Association of Marine Industries and of the Marina Recreation Association. Appointed 02/13/2014.
