Dear Senator Steinberg:

I authored Senate Bill 193 during the current 2013–14 Legislative Session with the intent to assist the Hazardous Evaluation System and Information Service (HESIS), maintained jointly at the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) and the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), to more efficiently carry out their legislative mandate.

Senate Bill 193 addresses an important public health need to protect both workers and employers. It provides authority to HESIS to collect product and customer information when it learns about a serious new or previously unrecognized health hazard posed by a toxic chemical. The types of serious health hazards that SB 193 addresses include cancer, reproductive harm, developmental harm, organ system impairment, and death. This legislation is intended to assist HESIS in fulfilling its legislative mandate, including providing reliable information of practical use to employers, employees, and others on the possible hazards from exposure to toxic materials. It is the intent of this bill that information shall be collected in circumstances similar to those that led to the production and distribution of nine health hazard alerts in the last 35 years.

Dear Mr. Schmidt,

I have authored Senate Bill 1281 to provide for enhanced reporting of water use in the state's oil and gas fields. I am submitting this letter to the Senate Journal to provide clarity to the intent of Senate Bill 1281.

Senate Bill 1281 retains and builds upon the existing oil and gas operations reporting framework in the Public Resources Code, which allows for estimation of water volumes when the exact amount is unknown.



It is not the intent of Senate Bill 1281 to require specific metering of each and every oil and gas well in the state.

Existing law already allows for estimates to be used. Public Resources Code 3227 requires that the owner of any oil or gas well in the state file a monthly report with the supervisor of the Division of Oil, Gas and Geothermal Resources (DOGGR) showing, “[t]he amount of oil and gas produced from each well during the period indicated, together with the gravity of the oil, the amount of water produced from each well, estimated in accordance with methods approved by the supervisor, and the number of days during which fluid was produced from each well.”

It is already common practice in the oil and gas industry for the operator to estimate water injection or production on a well-by-well basis where it is not specifically known because waters are commingled or not specifically metered. *See, e.g.*, DOGGR Publication M-04, Manually Prepared Production, Injection, and Disposition Reports (5th edition), p.9; DOGGR Publication M-05, Production and Injection Reporting for Computerized Operators (8th edition), p.2. Senate Bill 1281 does not contravene this practice, and respects that aggregated estimates may need to be used in certain cases.

To underscore this intent, SB 1281 allows for proportional assignment between wells when water is commingled, and does not require well-by-well reporting for the specific disposition of water that is treated or recycled, as the definition of specific disposition of all water does not specify that this tracking apply to “each well”. This recognizes that any oil and gas field water treatment and recycling is likely to use common facilities.
