To the President pro Tem and the Members of the Senate:

I write with respect to SB 270, a bill I have authored to phase out single use plastic bags in California. I wish to provide further information on my intentions regarding efforts by stores to encourage the use of reusable bags. Efforts specifically made to educate customers who are late adopters of reusable bags are consistent with Section 42283.7, pursuant to this bill.

Additionally, I wish to express that the status report compiled by California's Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle), as prescribed in Section 2 of Chapter 5.3 in the bill, can and should include data which tracks the use of reusable grocery bags and paper bags after the implementation of this bill. It is also my intent that stores provide data to CalRecycle regarding the number of transactions where customers have and have not purchased bags at the point of sale. This information would be of significant value in informing future policy and legislation.
