An act to amend Sections 300, 302, 303, 306, 307, 309, 351, 354, 355, 357, 358, 359, 360, 400, 420, 422, 425, 500, 501, 502, 503, 505, 506, 508, 509, 510, 511, 530, 531, 532, 533, 534, 535, and 536 of, to amend the heading of Part 2 (commencing with Section 350) of Division 3 of, to add Section 426 to, and to repeal Sections 353 and 424 of, the Family Code, and to amend Sections 100430, 102130, 102140, 102310, 102325, 102355, 103125, 103175, 103180, 103200, 103235, 103730, 103780, and 103785 of, and to repeal Section 103595 of, the Health and Safety Code, relating to marriage.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1102, as amended, Hancock. Marriage.

Existing law provides that marriage is a personal relation arising out of a civil contract between a man and a woman, and requires the licensure and solemnization thereof. Existing law provides for the issuance of marriage and confidential marriage licenses and sets the fees thereof. Existing law further imposes duties on county clerks in that connection, as specified.

This bill would, among other things, revise and recast those provisions and related terms. The bill would conform various statutory provisions of law to those changes. The bill would further regulate the issuance of confidential marriage licenses based upon an inability of the parties to appear, as specified, and would make related changes

with regard to notaries public and the State Registrar. In issuing a duplicate marriage license or confidential marriage license, the bill would allow the county clerk to charge any fee to cover the actual costs of issuing that duplicate license, and would change the fee charged notaries public for approval to issue confidential marriage licenses to \$400.

By adding to the duties of county employees to comply with those changes, this bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

~~This bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to these statutory provisions.~~

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that no reimbursement is required by this act for a specified reason.

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 300 of the Family Code is amended to
- 2 read:
- 3 300. (a) Marriage is a personal relation arising out of a civil
- 4 contract between a man and a woman, to which the consent of
- 5 the parties capable of making that contract is necessary. Consent
- 6 alone does not constitute marriage. Consent must be followed by
- 7 the issuance of a license and solemnization as authorized by this
- 8 division, except as provided by Section 425 and Part 4
- 9 (commencing with Section 500).
- 10 (b) For purposes of this part, the document issued by the
- 11 county clerk is a marriage license until it is registered with the
- 12 county recorder, at which time the license becomes a marriage
- 13 certificate.

1 SEC. 2. Section 302 of the Family Code is amended to read:

2 302. (a) An unmarried male or female under the age of 18
3 years is capable of consenting to and consummating marriage
4 upon obtaining a court order granting permission to the underage
5 person or persons to marry.

6 (b) The court order and written consent of the parents of each
7 underage person, or of one of the parents or the guardian of each
8 underage person shall be filed with the clerk of the court, and a
9 certified copy of the order shall be presented to the county clerk
10 at the time the marriage license is issued.

11 SEC. 3. Section 303 of the Family Code is amended to read:

12 303. If it appears to the satisfaction of the court by
13 application of a minor that the minor requires a written consent to
14 marry and that the minor has no parent or has no parent capable
15 of consenting, the court may make an order consenting to the
16 issuance of a marriage license and granting permission to the
17 minor to marry. The order shall be filed with the clerk of the
18 court and a certified copy of the order shall be presented to the
19 county clerk at the time the marriage license is issued.

20 SEC. 4. Section 306 of the Family Code is amended to read:

21 306. Except as provided in Section 307, a marriage shall be
22 licensed, solemnized, and authenticated, and the authenticated
23 marriage license shall be returned to the county recorder of the
24 county where the marriage license was issued, as provided in this
25 part. Noncompliance with this part by a nonparty to the marriage
26 does not invalidate the marriage.

27 SEC. 5. Section 307 of the Family Code is amended to read:

28 307. This division, so far as it relates to the solemnizing of
29 marriage, is not applicable to members of a particular religious
30 society or denomination not having clergy for the purpose of
31 solemnizing marriage or entering the marriage relation, if all of
32 the following requirements are met:

33 (a) The parties to the marriage sign and endorse on the form
34 prescribed by the State Department of Health Services, showing
35 all of the following:

- 36 (1) The fact, time, and place of entering into the marriage.
37 (2) The printed names, signatures, and mailing addresses of
38 two witnesses to the ceremony.
39 (3) The religious society or denomination of the parties to the
40 marriage, and that the marriage was entered into in accordance

1 with the rules and customs of that religious society or
2 denomination. The statement of the parties to the marriage that
3 the marriage was entered into in accordance with the rules and
4 customs of the religious society or denomination is conclusively
5 presumed to be true.

6 (b) The License and Certificate of Non-Clergy Marriage,
7 endorsed pursuant to subdivision (a), is returned to the county
8 recorder of the county in which the license was issued within 10
9 days after the ceremony.

10 SEC. 6. Section 309 of the Family Code is amended to read:

11 309. If either party to a marriage denies the marriage, or
12 refuses to join in a declaration of the marriage, the other party
13 may proceed, by action pursuant to Section 103450 of the Health
14 and Safety Code, to have the validity of the marriage determined
15 and declared.

16 SEC. 7. The heading of Part 2 (commencing with Section
17 350) of Division 3 of the Family Code is amended to read:

21 SEC. 8. Section 351 of the Family Code is amended to read:

22 351. The marriage license shall show all of the following:

23 (a) The identity of the parties to the marriage.

24 (b) The parties' full given names at birth or by court order, and
25 mailing addresses.

26 (c) The parties' dates of birth.

27 SEC. 9. Section 353 of the Family Code is repealed.

28 SEC. 10. Section 354 of the Family Code is amended to read:

29 354. (a) Each applicant for a marriage license shall be
30 required to present authentic photo identification acceptable to
31 the county clerk as to name and date of birth. A credible witness
32 affidavit or affidavits may be used in lieu of authentic photo
33 identification.

34 (b) For the purpose of ascertaining the facts mentioned or
35 required in this part, if the clerk deems it necessary, the clerk
36 may examine the applicants for a marriage license on oath at the
37 time of the application. The clerk shall reduce the examination to
38 writing and the applicants shall sign it.

39 (c) If necessary, the clerk may request additional documentary

2 battery, are against the law.

40 comply with Section 359, shall obtain a duplicate marriage

1 license by filing an affidavit setting forth the facts with the
2 county clerk of the county in which the license was issued.

3 (b) The duplicate marriage license may not be issued later than
4 one year after issuance of the original license and shall be
5 returned by the person solemnizing the marriage to the county
6 recorder within one year of the issuance date shown on the
7 original marriage license.

8 (c) The county clerk may charge a fee to cover the actual costs
9 of issuing a duplicate marriage license.

10 (d) If a marriage license is lost, damaged, or destroyed before
11 a marriage ceremony takes place, the applicants shall purchase a
12 new marriage license and the old license shall be voided.

13 SEC. 16. Section 400 of the Family Code is amended to read:
14 400. Marriage may be solemnized by any of the following
15 who is of the age of 18 years or older:

16 (a) A priest, minister, rabbi, or authorized person of any
17 religious denomination.

18 (b) A judge or retired judge, commissioner of civil marriages
19 or retired commissioner of civil marriages, commissioner or
20 retired commissioner, or assistant commissioner of a court of
21 record in this state.

22 (c) A judge or magistrate who has resigned from office.

23 (d) Any of the following judges or magistrates of the United
24 States:

25 (1) A justice or retired justice of the United States Supreme
26 Court.

27 (2) A judge or retired judge of a court of appeals, a district
28 court, or a court created by an act of Congress the judges of
29 which are entitled to hold office during good behavior.

30 (3) A judge or retired judge of a bankruptcy court or a tax
31 court.

32 (4) A United States magistrate or retired magistrate.

33 (e) A legislator or constitutional officer of this state or a
34 Member of Congress who represents a district within this state,
35 while that person holds office.

36 SEC. 17. Section 420 of the Family Code is amended to read:

37 420. (a) No particular form for the ceremony of marriage is
38 required for solemnization of the marriage, but the parties shall
39 declare, in the physical presence of the person solemnizing the

1 marriage and necessary witnesses, that they take each other as
2 husband and wife.

3 (b) Notwithstanding subdivision (a), a member of the Armed
4 Forces of the United States who is stationed overseas and serving
5 in a conflict or a war and is unable to appear for the licensure and
6 solemnization of the marriage may enter into that marriage by the
7 appearance of an attorney in fact, commissioned and empowered
8 in writing for that purpose through a power of attorney. The
9 attorney-in-fact must personally appear at the county clerk's
10 office with the party who is not stationed overseas, and present
11 the original power of attorney duly signed by the party stationed
12 overseas and acknowledged by a notary or witnessed by two
13 officers of the United States Armed Forces. Copies in any form,
14 including by facsimile, are not acceptable. The power of attorney

19 solemnization of the marriage. The original power of attorney
20 shall be a part of the marriage certificate upon registration.

21 (c) No contract of marriage, if otherwise duly made, shall be
22 invalidated for want of conformity to the requirements of any
23 religious sect.

24 SEC. 18. Section 422 of the Family Code is amended to read:

25 422. The person solemnizing a marriage shall, sign and print
26 or type upon the marriage license a statement, in the form
27 prescribed by the State Department of Health Services, showing
28 all of the following:

29 (a) The fact, date (month, day, year), and place (city and
30 county) of solemnization.

31 (b) The printed names, signatures, and mailing addresses of at
32 least one, and no more than two, witnesses to the ceremony.

33 (c) The official position of the person solemnizing the
34 marriage, or of the denomination of which that person is a priest,
35 minister, rabbi, or other authorized person of any religious

1 425. If no record of the solemnization of a California

3 marriage is known to exist, the parties may purchase a License
4 and Certificate of Declaration of Marriage from the county clerk
5 in the parties' county of residence one year or more from the date
6 of the marriage. The license and certificate shall be returned to
7 the county recorder of the county in which the license was
8 issued.

10 426. If for sufficient reason, as described in subdivision (d),
11 either or both of the parties to be married are physically unable to

32 (b) For purposes of this part, the document issued by the
33 county clerk is a marriage license until it is registered with the
34 county clerk, at which time the license becomes a marriage
35 certificate.

36 SEC. 23. Section 501 of the Family Code is amended to read:

37 501. Except as provided in Section 502, a confidential
38 marriage license shall be issued by the county clerk upon the
39 personal appearance together of the parties to be married and
40 their payment of the fees required by Sections 26840.1 and

1 26840.8 of the Government Code and any fee imposed pursuant
2 to the authorization of Section 26840.3 of the Government Code.

31 505. (a) The form of the confidential marriage license shall
32 be prescribed by the State Registrar of Vital Statistics.

2 to the person solemnizing the marriage.

3 (b) Upon performance of the ceremony, the solemnization
4 section on the confidential marriage license shall be completed
5 by the person solemnizing the marriage.

6 (c) The confidential marriage license shall be returned by the
7 person solemnizing the marriage to the office of the county clerk
8 in the county in which the license was issued within 10 days after
9 the ceremony.

10 SEC. 28. Section 508 of the Family Code is amended to read:

11 508. Upon issuance of a confidential marriage license, parties
12 shall be provided with an application to obtain a certified copy of
13 the confidential marriage certificate from the county clerk.

14 SEC. 29. Section 509 of the Family Code is amended to read:

15 509. (a) A party to a confidential marriage may obtain a
16 certified copy of the confidential marriage certificate from the
17 county clerk of the county in which the certificate is filed in any
18 of the following ways:

19 (1) By submitting the application for a certified copy of the
20 confidential marriage certificate provided to the parties pursuant
21 to Section 508.

22 (2) By personally appearing before a notary public or at the
23 county clerk's office in the party's county of residence,
24 producing valid photo identification, obtaining a certificate

37 or destroyed after the performance of the marriage, but before it
38 is returned to the county clerk, or deemed unacceptable for
39 registration by the county clerk, the person solemnizing the
40 marriage, in order to comply with Section 506, shall obtain a

1 duplicate marriage license by filing an affidavit setting forth the
2 facts with the county clerk of the county in which the license was
3 issued.

17 open to public inspection except upon order of the court issued
18 upon a showing of good cause. The confidential marriage license
19 is a confidential record and not open to public inspection without
20 an order from the court.

21 (b) The county clerk shall keep all original certificates of
22 confidential marriages for one year from the date of filing. After
23 one year, the clerk may reproduce the certificates pursuant to
24 Section 26205 of the Government Code, and dispose of the
25 original certificates. The county clerk shall promptly seal and
26 store at least one original negative of each microphotographic
27 film made in a manner and place as reasonable to ensure its
28 preservation indefinitely against loss, theft, defacement, or
29 destruction. The microphotograph shall be made in a manner that
30 complies with the minimum standards or guidelines, or both,
31 recommended by the American National Standards Institute or
32 the Association for Information and Image Management. Every
33 reproduction shall be deemed and considered an original. A
34 certified copy of any reproduction shall be deemed and
35 considered a certified copy of the original.

36 (c) The county clerk may conduct a search for a confidential
37 marriage certificate for the purpose of confirming the existence
38 of a marriage, but the date of the marriage and any other
39 information contained in the certificate shall not be disclosed
40 except upon order of the court.

1 SEC. 32. Section 530 of the Family Code is amended to read:

2 530. (a) No notary public shall issue a confidential marriage
3 license pursuant to this part unless the notary public is approved
4 by the county clerk to issue confidential marriage licenses
5 pursuant to this chapter.

6 (b) A violation of subdivision (a) is a misdemeanor punishable
7 by a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or six
8 months in jail.

10 531. (a) If the county clerk chooses to accept applications
11 authorizing a notary public to issue confidential marriage
12 licenses, the county clerk shall establish a policy that outlines the

15 approval to issue confidential marriage licenses pursuant to this
16 part with the county clerk in the county in which the notary

2 instruction shall be given by the county clerk at a date and time
