Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 37—Relative to California Public Safety Telecommunicators Week.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

ACR 37, as amended, Torres. California Public Safety Telecommunicators Week.

This measure memorializes the week beginning April 12, 2009, as California Public Safety Telecommunicators Week.

1 WHEREAS, Over one-half million dedicated men and women
2 are engaged in the operation of emergency response systems for
3 federal, state, and local governmental entities throughout the United
4 States; and

5 WHEREAS, An estimated 55,000 dedicated men and women
6 are engaged in answering 911 calls and operating the emergency
7 response systems in California; and

8 WHEREAS, These individuals are responsible for responding
9 to the telephone calls of the general public for police, fire, and
10 emergency medical assistance, and for dispatching this critical
11 assistance necessary to help save the lives and property of our
12 citizens; and

13 WHEREAS, Emergency calls include not only police, fire, and
14 emergency medical service calls, but those of governmental
15 communications related to forestry and conservation operations,
16 highway safety and maintenance activities, and all of the other
17 operations which an effective governmental agency must conduct;
18 and

19 WHEREAS, Public safety telecommunicators are the first point
20 of contact for most interactions between members of the public
21 and the public safety systems that keep Californians safe, and the
22 public expects and receives extraordinarily dedicated service from
23 these individuals; and

24 WHEREAS, America's public safety telecommunicators serve
25 the public in countless ways each day, often without recognition
26 by the beneficiaries of their services; and

27 WHEREAS, Congress has designated the week of April 12 to
28 April 18, 2009, as National Public Safety Telecommunicators
29 Week; now, therefore, be it

30 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, the Senate*
31 *thereof concurring*, That the week beginning April 12, 2009, is
32 designated as California Public Safety Telecommunicators Week,
33 and the Governor is requested to issue a proclamation calling on
34 the people of the State of California to observe the week with
35 appropriate ceremonies and activities; and be it further

1 *Resolved*, That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly transmit copies
2 of this resolution to the author for appropriate distribution.
