Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 164—Relative to the Deputy Sheriff Joel B. Wahlenmaier Memorial Highway.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL’S DIGEST

ACR 164, as amended, Villines. Deputy Sheriff Joel B. Wahlenmaier Memorial Highway.

This measure would designate a specified portion of State Highway Route 168 in Fresno County as the Deputy Sheriff Joel B. Wahlenmaier Memorial Highway. The measure would also request the Department of Transportation to determine the cost of appropriate signs showing this special designation and, upon receiving donations from nonstate sources covering those costs, to erect those signs.

Fiscal committee: yes.

- 1 WHEREAS, Deputy Sheriff Joel B. Wahlenmaier of the Fresno
- 2 County Sheriff’s Office was killed on February 25, 2010, while
- 3 in performance of his duties to the citizens he was sworn to protect;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, Deputy Sheriff Wahlenmaier was born in
- 6 Bakersfield and raised in Fresno, attending local schools and
- 7 Reedley College. Upon joining the Fresno County Sheriff’s Office
- 8 in 1998, Deputy Sheriff Wahlenmaier worked in the Patrol Division

1 and as a detective assigned to the Robbery/Property Crimes and
2 Homicide units. He was also a long-time member of the Sheriff's
3 Search & Rescue Team. Deputy Sheriff Wahlenmaier was a
4 dedicated officer who served his community and loved his
5 profession; and

6 WHEREAS, On February 25, 2010, Deputy Sheriff
7 Wahlenmaier was investigating a felony assault case in the town
8 of Minkler, California, in eastern Fresno County. While ~~being~~
9 ~~served~~ Deputy Sheriff Wahlenmaier was serving a search warrant,
10 the suspect ambushed ~~the deputies~~ law enforcement officers with
11 gunfire. Deputy Sheriff Wahlenmaier suffered gunshot wounds
12 that resulted in his death upon his arrival at Community Regional
13 Medical Center. The subsequent investigation found that the
14 suspect, a 51-year-old Minkler man, was angry with other residents
15 of the town and had planned to ambush law enforcement officers
16 if they attempted to contact him. The suspect committed suicide
17 during the incident. Reedley Police Officer Javier Bejar was also
18 killed in the gun battle; and

19 WHEREAS, Deputy Sheriff Wahlenmaier is survived by his
20 loving wife Beverly, and his two children, daughter Amy and son
21 Austin. He is also survived by his parents, Arthur and Patricia
22 Wahlenmaier, his sister Natalie (Wahlenmaier) Tomajan, and
23 brother Tyler Wahlenmaier; and

24 WHEREAS, It is appropriate to memorialize Deputy Sheriff
25 Wahlenmaier's sacrifice by naming a portion of State Highway
26 Route 168 in his honor, and to remember the sacrifices made by
27 California peace officers across the state who risk their lives daily
28 to protect citizens' lives; now, therefore, be it

29 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, the Senate*
30 *thereof concurring*, That the Legislature hereby recognizes the
31 sacrifice made by Deputy Sheriff Wahlenmaier to protect the
32 people of California and designates the portion of State Highway
33 Route 168 from approximately 0.5 miles east of Lodge Road to
34 Ockenden Ranch Road in Fresno County as the Deputy Sheriff
35 Joel B. Wahlenmaier Memorial Highway; and be it further

36 *Resolved*, That the Department of Transportation is requested
37 to determine the cost of erecting the appropriate signs, consistent
38 with the signing requirements for the state highway system,
39 showing this special designation and, upon receiving donations

- 1 from nonstate sources covering the cost, to erect those signs; and
- 2 be it further
- 3 *Resolved*, That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly transmit copies
- 4 of this resolution to the Department of Transportation and to the
- 5 author for appropriate distribution.

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
