An act to amend Sections 53114.2, 53115.1, and 53115.2 of the Government Code, relating to emergency telephone systems.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 423, as amended, Torres. Emergency telephone systems.

Existing law, the Warren-911-Emergency Assistance Act, requires the Communications Division of the Department of General Services to review and update technical and operational standards for public agency systems, after consultation with specified entities and individuals.

The bill would require the review and update of technical and operational standards for public agency systems to include standards for recruitment and training of public safety dispatchers.

Existing law also requires the State 911 Advisory Board to advise the Communications Division on specified subjects, including training standards for county coordinators and public safety answering point managers.

The bill would add-a *one* representative from the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training *and one representative from the Office of the State Fire Marshal* to the State 911 Advisory Board. The bill would also modify the requirement that the State 911 Advisory Board advise the Communications Division on training standards for county coordinators and public safety answering point managers to also

require the State 911 Advisory Board to advise the Communications Division on training standards for public safety dispatchers, and advise the department concerning issues related to the receipt of calls in a language other than English.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 53114.2 of the Government Code is
2 amended to read:

3 53114.2. Technical and operational standards for the
4 development of the public agency systems shall be established and
5 reviewed by the Communications Division on or before December
6 31, 1973, after consultation with all entities and individuals
7 specified in Section 53114.1. On or before December 31, 1976,
8 and each even-numbered year thereafter, after consultation with
9 all entities and individuals specified in Section 53114.1, the
10 Communications Division shall review and update technical and
11 operational standards for public agency systems, including, but
12 not limited to, standards for recruitment and training of public
13 safety dispatchers.

14 SEC. 2. Section 53115.1 of the Government Code is amended
15 to read:

16 53115.1. (a) There is in state government the State 911
17 Advisory Board.

18 (b) The advisory board shall be comprised of the following
19 members appointed by the Governor who shall serve at the pleasure
20 of the Governor.

21 (1) The Chief of the California 911 Emergency Communications
22 Office shall serve as the nonvoting chair of the board.

23 (2) One representative from the Department of the California
24 Highway Patrol.

25 (3) Two representatives on the recommendation of the California
26 Police Chiefs Association.

27 (4) Two representatives on the recommendation of the California
28 State Sheriffs' Association.

29 (5) Two representatives on the recommendation of the California
30 Fire Chiefs Association.

1 (6) Two representatives on the recommendation of the CalNENA
2 Executive Board.

3 (7) One representative on the joint recommendation of the
4 executive boards of the state chapters of the Association of
5 Public-Safety Communications Officials-International, Inc.

6 (8) One representative from the Commission on Peace Officer
7 Standards and Training.

8 (9) *One representative from the Office of the State Fire Marshal.*

9 (c) Recommending authorities shall give great weight and
10 consideration to the knowledge, training, and expertise of the
11 appointee with respect to their experience within the California
12 911 system. Board members should have at least two years of
13 experience as a public safety answering point manager or county
14 coordinator, except where a specific person is designated as a
15 member.

16 (d) Members of the advisory board shall serve at the pleasure
17 of the Governor, but may not serve more than two consecutive
18 two-year terms, except as follows:

19 (1) The presiding Chief of the California 911 Emergency
20 Communications Office shall serve for the duration of his or her
21 tenure.

22 (2) Four of the members shall serve an initial term of three years.

23 (e) Advisory board members shall not receive compensation
24 for their service on the board, but may be reimbursed for travel
25 and per diem for time spent in attending meetings of the board.

26 (f) The advisory board shall meet quarterly in public sessions
27 in accordance with the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act (Article
28 9 (commencing with Section 11120) of Chapter 2 of Part 1 of
29 Division 3 of Title 2). The Telecommunications Division shall
30 provide administrative support to the State 911 Advisory Board.
31 The State 911 Advisory Board, at its first meeting, shall adopt
32 bylaws and operating procedures consistent with this article and
33 establish committees as necessary.

34 (g) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any member
35 of the advisory board may designate a person to act as that member
36 in his or her place and stead for all purposes, as though the member
37 were personally present.

38 SEC. 3. Section 53115.2 of the Government Code is amended
39 to read:

1 53115.2. (a) The State 911 Advisory Board shall advise the
2 Communications Division of the Department of General Services
3 on all of the following subjects:

4 (1) Policies, practices, and procedures for the California 911
5 Emergency Communications Office.

6 (2) Technical and operational standards for the California 911
7 system consistent with the National Emergency Number
8 Association (NENA) standards.

9 (3) Training standards for county coordinators, Public Safety
10 Answering Point (PSAP) managers, and public safety dispatchers.

11 (4) Budget, funding, and reimbursement decisions related to
12 the State Emergency Number Account.

13 (5) Proposed projects and studies conducted or funded by the
14 State Emergency Number Account.

15 (6) Expediting the rollout of Enhanced 911 Phase II technology.

16 (b) Upon request of a local public agency, the board shall
17 conduct a hearing on any conflict between a local public agency
18 and the Communications Division regarding a final plan that has
19 not been approved by the Communications Division pursuant to
20 Section 53114. The board shall meet within 30 days following the
21 request, and shall make a recommendation to resolve the conflict
22 to the Communications Division within 90 days following the
23 initial hearing by the board pursuant to the request.
