Memorial Week.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SCR 29, as amended, Correa. Black April Memorial Week.

This measure would proclaim the week of April 23 to April 30, ~~2009~~
2010, inclusive, as Black April Memorial Week, a special time for
Californians to remember the countless lives lost during the Vietnam
War era, and to hope for a more humane and just life for the people of
Vietnam.

- 1 WHEREAS, April 30, ~~2009~~, marks the 34th 2010, marks the
- 2 35th anniversary of the fall of Saigon on April 30, 1975, to
- 3 communism; and
- 4 WHEREAS, For many Vietnam and Vietnam-era veterans who
- 5 were directly involved in the war and Vietnamese Americans who
- 6 have settled in the United States, the Vietnam War was a tragedy
- 7 full of great suffering and the loss of American, Vietnamese, and
- 8 Southeast Asian lives; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Fifty-eight thousand one hundred sixty-nine people
- 10 were killed and 304,000 were wounded out of the 2.59 million

1 people who served in the Vietnam War. One out of every 10
2 Americans who served in Vietnam became a casualty of war; and
3 WHEREAS, After the fall of Saigon, over 135,000 Vietnamese
4 fled to the United States, including former military and government
5 officials and Vietnamese who had worked for the United States
6 during the war, and their families; and

7 WHEREAS, Thousands of people took boats in order to leave
8 Vietnam in the late 1970s to mid-1980s. The successful ones
9 reached refugee camps in Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia, the
10 Philippines, and Hong Kong; while approximately one-half of the
11 people fleeing Vietnam perished at sea; and

12 WHEREAS, According to the United States Census for 2000,
13 *more than* 447,032 Vietnamese live in California, with the largest
14 concentration of Vietnamese found outside of Vietnam residing
15 in Orange County; and

16 WHEREAS, We must teach our children and future generations
17 important lessons from the Vietnam War, including how the plight
18 of the Vietnamese refugees following the end of war serves as a
19 powerful example of the values of freedom and democracy; and

20 WHEREAS, We, the people of California, should actively
21 rededicate ourselves to the principles of human rights, individual
22 freedom, and equal protection under the laws of a just and
23 democratic world. Californians should set aside moments of time
24 every year on April 30 to give remembrance to the soldiers, medical
25 personnel, and civilians who died during the Vietnam War era in
26 pursuit of freedom; and

27 WHEREAS, Vietnamese American communities throughout
28 California will commemorate April 30, ~~2009~~ 2010, as Black April,
29 a day of remembrance; now, therefore, be it

30 *Resolved by the Senate of the State of California, the Assembly*
31 *thereof concurring*, That in recognition of the great tragedy and
32 suffering and lives lost during the Vietnam War era, the week of
33 April 23, ~~2009~~, to April 30, ~~2009~~ 2010, to April 30, 2010, inclusive,
34 shall be proclaimed Black April Memorial Week, a special time
35 for Californians to remember the countless lives lost during the
36 Vietnam War era, and to hope for a more humane and just life for
37 the people of Vietnam; and be it further
