An act to amend Section 44062.3 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to air pollution.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1389, as introduced, Padilla. Air pollution: motor vehicle inspection.

Existing law authorizes the owner of a motor vehicle that has failed its most recent smog check inspection to retire the vehicle from operation at a dismantler under contract with the Bureau of Automotive Repair, and requires the Department of Consumer Affairs to pay this person up to \$1,500 or more, as specified.

This bill would make a technical, nonsubstantive change to these provisions.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 44062.3 of the Health and Safety Code
- 2 is amended to read:
- 3 44062.3. The owner of a motor vehicle that has failed its most
- 4 recent smog check inspection may retire the vehicle from operation
- 5 at a dismantler under contract with the Bureau of Automotive
- 6 Repair. The department shall pay a person who retires his or her
- 7 vehicle under this section up to one thousand five hundred dollars
- 8 (\$1,500). The department may pay ~~an~~ *the* owner of a motor vehicle
- 9 who elects to retire the vehicle more than one thousand five

- 1 hundred dollars (\$1,500), if the department determines that this
- 2 payment is cost effective.
