Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 50—Relative to the Deputy Daniel Lee Archuleta Memorial Highway.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SCR 50, as amended, Fuller. Deputy Daniel Lee Archuleta Memorial Interchange.

This measure would designate the interchange of State Highway Route 99 and State Highway Route 119 as the Deputy Daniel Lee Archuleta Memorial Interchange. The measure would request the Department of Transportation to determine the cost of appropriate signs showing this designation and, upon receiving donations from nonstate sources covering that cost, to erect those signs.

Fiscal committee: yes.

1 WHEREAS, Daniel Lee Archuleta was born in Huntington
2 Beach, California; and
3 WHEREAS, Daniel Lee Archuleta attended Golden West
4 College, where he received an Associate of Arts degree on October
5 20, 1996, and subsequently attended California State University
6 at Long Beach, where he received a bachelor's degree on May 28,
7 1999; and
8 WHEREAS, Daniel Lee Archuleta attended, and graduated
9 from, the academy of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department
10 at East Los Angeles College on February 20, 2001, and began

1 employment with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department
2 in February of 2001; and

3 WHEREAS, Daniel Lee Archuleta was hired by the Kern County
4 Sheriff's Department on October 5, 2002, and was assigned to the
5 Support Services Bureau, the Training Division, and the Resource
6 Pool, and also worked temporarily in the Court Services Division.
7 Daniel Lee Archuleta transferred to the Law Enforcement Bureau,
8 South Area Substation Division, Taft Court on November 2, 2002,
9 and on May 27, 2003, he entered the Field Training Officer
10 Program and was promoted to Deputy Sheriff II on October 4,
11 2003; and

12 WHEREAS, Daniel Lee Archuleta was killed on September 12,
13 2004, when his patrol vehicle rolled over on Tupman Road, just
14 north of the west Kern County town of Tupman, while he was
15 traveling south on Tupman Road responding to an emergency call;
16 and

17 WHEREAS, A deputy from the Kern County Sheriff's
18 Department driving north on Tupman Road found the battered
19 patrol vehicle in the southbound lane of Tupman Road, and Daniel
20 Lee Archuleta was found dead at the scene; and

21 WHEREAS, California Highway Patrol investigative units from
22 Bakersfield and Fresno were called to the scene but were unable
23 to ascertain the cause of the accident; and

24 WHEREAS, Daniel Lee Archuleta leaves behind his wife, Laura
25 and, his two daughters, Victoria and Isabella, *his parents, Don and*
26 *Linda, his brother, Matt, and many other family members*; now,
27 therefore, be it

28 *Resolved by the Senate of the State of California, the Assembly*
29 *thereof concurring*, That in recognition of the distinguished and
30 dedicated public service by Daniel Lee Archuleta, the Legislature
31 designates the interchange of State Highway Route 99 and State
32 Highway Route 119 the Deputy Daniel Lee Archuleta Memorial
33 Interchange; and be it further

34 *Resolved*, That the Department of Transportation is requested
35 to determine the cost of appropriate signs consistent with the
36 signing requirements for the state highway system, showing this
37 special designation and, upon receiving donations from nonstate
38 sources sufficient to cover the cost, to erect those signs; and be it
39 further

1 *Resolved*, That the Secretary of the Senate transmit copies of
2 this resolution to the Department of Transportation and to the
3 author for appropriate distribution.

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
