SENATE BILL

No. 449

Introduced by Senator Pavley

February 16, 2011

An act to add and repeal Article 6 (commencing with Section 12485) of Chapter 5 of Part 2 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, relating to state government.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 449, as amended, Pavley. Controller: local agency financial review.

Existing law requires certain local agencies to furnish reports to the Controller concerning financial transactions of the local agency, subject to uniform accounting and reporting procedures prescribed by the Controller. The Controller may provide for the investigation of certain local agency finances if a report is not made in the time, form, and manner required or there is reason to believe that a report is false, incomplete, or incorrect.

This bill would additionally authorize the Controller to conduct a preliminary review to determine the existence of a local agency financial problem, and perform an audit upon completion of that review, subject to specified criteria.

The bill would require the Controller to convene a local agency financial review committee with a specified membership, and authorize the committee to recommend a financial recovery plan for a local agency requesting assistance. It would require the ~~committee~~ Controller to report to the Legislature annually on the actions of the committee and

the status of all engagements with local agencies pursuant to these provisions.

The bill would specify that its provisions would be repealed on January 1, 2017.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The Legislature finds all of the following:

2 (1) The economic recession has disproportionately affected
3 California and, in particular, the local agencies that deliver vital
4 services to the public. Many local agencies have been forced to
5 take unprecedented steps to avert financial crisis and maintain a
6 sound credit rating.

7 (2) The State of California has a vital financial interest in the
8 solvency of its local agencies. When insolvency occurs at a local
9 agency, the state's credit rating can be negatively impacted, costing
10 the state millions of dollars, making borrowing more difficult, and
11 hindering the state's economic recovery.

12 (3) The health and welfare of the citizens of the state would be
13 adversely affected by the insolvency of local agencies. Therefore,
14 the fiscal health of local agencies is vitally necessary to the interests
15 of this state in providing necessary governmental services.

16 (b) Accordingly, the Legislature declares that it is a valid public
17 purpose for the state to assist a local agency in a fiscal emergency
18 situation by supporting prudent fiscal management, and that the
19 authority and powers conferred by this act constitute a necessary
20 program and serve a valid public purpose.

21 SEC. 2. Article 6 (commencing with Section 12485) is added
22 to Chapter 5 of Part 2 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government
23 Code, to read:

25 Article 6. Local Agency Financial Review and Assistance

27 12485. (a) The Controller may conduct a preliminary review
28 to determine the existence of a local agency financial problem if
29 one or more of the following occur:

30 (1) (A) The governing body, chief administrative officer, or
31 chief executive of a local agency requests a preliminary review

1 under this section. The request shall be in writing and shall identify
2 the existing fiscal conditions that make the request necessary.

3 (B) If the local agency requests a review, any costs incurred
4 pursuant to this paragraph shall be borne by the local agency.

5 (2) (A) The Controller receives a written request from a creditor
6 with an undisputed claim against the local agency that exceeds the
7 greater of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) or 1 percent of the annual
8 general fund budget of the local agency, and that remains unpaid
9 six months after its due date, provided that no less than 30 days
10 prior to submitting the request, the creditor notifies the local agency
11 in writing of his or her intention to submit the request.

12 (B) For purposes of this subdivision, a claim shall be deemed
13 undisputed unless the local agency has made a determination that
14 any of the following conditions are present:

15 (i) There is a discrepancy between the invoice or claimed amount
16 and the provisions of the contract or grant.

17 (ii) There is a discrepancy between the invoice or claimed
18 amount and either the claimant's actual delivery of property or
19 services to the local agency or the local agency's acceptance of
20 that delivery or deliveries.

21 (iii) Additional evidence supporting the validity of the invoice
22 or claimed amount is required to be provided to the local agency
23 by the claimant.

24 (iv) The invoice has been improperly executed or needs to be
25 corrected by the claimant.

26 (v) There is a discrepancy between the refund or other payment
27 due as calculated by the person to whom the money is owed and
28 by the local agency.

29 (3) The Controller receives notification from the trustee, actuary,
30 or at least 10 percent of the beneficiaries of a local agency pension
31 fund alleging that the local agency has not timely deposited its
32 minimum obligation payment to the pension fund as required by
33 law.

34 (4) The Controller receives notification that employees of the
35 local agency have not been paid and it has been at least seven days
36 after the scheduled date of payment.

37 (5) The Controller receives notification from a trustee, paying
38 agent, or bondholder of a default in a bond payment, or a violation
39 of one or more bond covenants, by a local agency.

1 (6) The Controller receives notification that the local agency is
2 delinquent in the distribution of tax revenues as required by law.

3 (7) *The Controller receives notification that the local agency*
4 *has a critical cash flow situation, evidenced by a midyear*
5 *borrowing not anticipated in the most recently enacted budget.*

6 (8) *The Controller receives notification that a local agency has*
7 *enacted a midyear budget correction.*

8 (9) *The Controller receives notification that a local agency has*
9 *implemented retirements and layoffs constituting greater than 20*
10 *percent of the local agency's workforce, relative to the prior year*
11 *budget.*

12 (10) *The Controller receives notification that a local agency*
13 *has reduced its police or fire services funding by more than 50*
14 *percent, relative to the prior year budget.*

15 (11) *The Controller receives notification that a local agency*
16 *has had a decline in assessed property values of 10 percent or*
17 *greater.*

18 (12) *The Controller receives notification that a local agency*
19 *has had a decline in year-over-year general fund collections of*
20 *greater than 15 percent.*

21 (13) *The Controller receives notification that a local agency*
22 *has had deficits in major restricted funds, defined as providing*
23 *greater than 10 percent of the local agency's annual total budget.*

25 (14) The local agency fails to provide an annual financial report
26 or audit that conforms with the minimum procedures and standards
27 of the Controller as required by law.

28 (b) In conducting a preliminary review pursuant to this section,
29 the Controller shall provide the local agency written notification
30 of the review, and shall meet with the local agency officials to
31 receive, discuss, and consider information provided by the local
32 agency concerning the agency's financial condition.

33 (c) The Controller shall provide written notification to the
34 Governor and the Legislature within 120 days after beginning a
35 preliminary review pursuant to this section, when the review has
36 determined that one or more conditions indicative of a serious
37 financial problem may exist within the local agency.

38 12486. (a) Upon completion of a preliminary review conducted
39 pursuant to Section 12485, *or under the conditions specified in*
40 *subdivision (b) of this section*, the Controller may conduct an audit

1 of the local agency ~~that was the subject of the preliminary review.~~
2 The local agency shall make its books and records available to the
3 Controller for this purpose.

4 (b) The audit shall be conducted for purposes of determining if
5 one or more of the following conditions indicative of a serious
6 financial problem have occurred, or are likely to occur, if remedial
7 action is not taken:

8 (1) A default in the payment of principal or interest upon bonded
9 indebtedness for which no funds, or insufficient funds, are on hand
10 and segregated in a special trust fund.

11 (2) Failure for a period of 30 days or more beyond the due date
12 to transfer one or more of the following to the appropriate agency:

13 (A) Taxes withheld on the income of employees.

14 (B) Taxes collected by the local agency as agent for another
15 governmental entity or taxing authority.

16 (C) Any contribution required by a pension, retirement, or
17 benefit plan.

18 (3) Failure for a period of 30 days or more to pay wages and
19 salaries or other compensation or benefits owed to local agency
20 employees or retirees.

21 (4) The total amount of accounts payable for the current fiscal
22 year, as determined by the financial records of the local agency,
23 is in excess of 10 percent of the total expenditures of the local
24 agency in that fiscal year.

25 (5) Failure to eliminate an existing deficit in any fund of the
26 local agency within the two-year period preceding the end of the
27 local agency's fiscal year for which a preliminary review was
28 conducted pursuant to Section 12485.

29 (6) Projection of a deficit in the general fund of the local agency
30 for the current fiscal year in excess of 10 percent of the budgeted
31 revenues for the general fund.

32 12487. (a) The Controller shall convene a local agency
33 financial review committee to provide assistance to local agencies
34 ~~who~~ that seek help in averting or managing a financial problem.
35 The committee shall meet no less than annually.

36 (b) The committee shall be chaired by the Controller and include
37 representatives of the office of the Treasurer and the Department
38 of Finance.

39 (c) The Controller shall utilize the services of a consultant
40 having extensive financial management and accounting experience

1 with local agencies in the state, to assist in evaluating and assisting
2 local agencies—~~who~~ *that* are undergoing or facing a financial
3 problem.

4 (d) A local agency may request assistance from the committee
5 in meeting the ordinary needs of government operations. The
6 request shall identify the existing financial conditions that make
7 the request necessary.

8 (e) *A local agency that meets the conditions described in Section*
9 *12486 shall receive priority consideration by the local agency*
10 *financial review committee.*

12 (f) In consultation with the local agency requesting assistance,
13 and using any applicable data from a preliminary review or audit
14 conducted pursuant to this article *if a preliminary review or audit*
15 *has occurred*, the committee shall recommend a financial recovery
16 plan for the local agency. The financial recovery plan shall consider
17 both of the following:

18 (1) Conducting the operations of the local agency within the
19 resources available according to the data provided by the local
20 agency.

21 (2) The payment in full of the scheduled debt service
22 requirements on all bonded and other indebtedness and other
23 uncontested legal obligations of the local agency.

25 (g) The Controller shall report to the Legislature, no later than
26 June 30, 2012, and annually thereafter, on the actions of the
27 committee and status of all engagements with local agencies
28 pursuant to this section.

29 12488. For purposes of this article, “local agency” means a
30 city, county, city and county, special district, or redevelopment
31 agency.

32 12489. This article shall remain in effect only until January 1,
33 2017, and as of that date is repealed, unless a later enacted statute,
34 that is enacted before January 1, 2017, deletes or extends that date.
