

Senate Resolution No. 22

Introduced by Senator Huff

Relative to School Choice Week

WHEREAS, The California Constitution requires the Legislature to encourage by all suitable means the promotion of intellectual, scientific, moral, and agricultural improvement; and

WHEREAS, Excellence in education is a primary goal of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, California's student body is one of the most diverse in the world and therefore requires diverse educational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, A child's residence should not determine the quality of his or her education; and

WHEREAS, All students in California, regardless of background, should have access to the highest quality schools possible; and

WHEREAS, Taxpayers and parents who fund the public school system should be able to choose which school is best for their children within state and local legal parameters; and

WHEREAS, School choice promotes parental involvement; and

WHEREAS, School choice spans all socioeconomic, political, cultural, and ethnic groups; and

WHEREAS, California recognizes the many high-quality teachers and school employees in public and private schools who are committed to educating children; and

WHEREAS, Parents, students, and teachers in states across the nation come together each year to recognize school choice and the need for effective educational options for all children; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate of the State of California, That the Senate proclaims the week of January 26, 2014, through February 1, 2014, as "School Choice Week"; and be it further

Resolved, That the Secretary of the Senate transmit copies of this resolution to the author for appropriate distribution.
